ORDINANCE 2019-03-21-0229

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE ALAMO AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (AAMPO), THE EXECUTION OF GRANT DOCUMENTS, AND ACCEPTANCE OF FEDERAL FUNDS IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$48,320,000.00 FROM FEDERAL FUNDS FOR 15 PROPOSED PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS IN THE TOTAL ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF \$60,400,000.00 WITH A POTENTIAL CITY MATCH OF \$14,760,000.00 FOR CONSIDERATION THROUGH THE FY 2020-2022 CONGESTION MITIGATION AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) PROGRAM.

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WHEREAS, in July 2018 the AAMPO, which includes all of Bexar, Comal, and Guadalupe Counties, and a portion of Kendall County, was designated marginal non-attainment by the Environmental Protection Agency under the National Ambient Air Quality Standards effective September 24, 2018; and

WHEREAS, due to the marginal non-attainment designation, Bexar County is eligible to receive CMAQ funding to assist in meeting transportation conformity requirements; and

WHEREAS, while AAMPO selects projects for CMAQ funding, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is the federally designated pass-through agency for this funding source and the City will be required to enter into an agreement with TxDOT and to reimburse TxDOT its costs for review and coordination of the project or program; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to authorize the submission of the grant application to the AAMPO for funding in the amount of \$48,320,000.00 from federal funds for 11 proposed projects and programs through the FY 2020-2022 CMAQ program and 4 projects in the amount of \$2,680,000.00 to be funded from future fiscal year budgets and authorizing the execution of grant documents and acceptance of federal funds if awarded; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or his designee, or the Director of the Transportation and Capital Improvements Department or his designee, is hereby authorized to apply for, accept and execute grant documents for grant funds in the amount up to \$48,320,000.00 from the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization to fund 11 projects (listed below) under the FY 2020-2022 Congestion Mitigation Air Quality program. The City will also be providing a cash match of up to \$12,080,000.00 which will be appropriated in various funds contingent upon the approval of the future fiscal year budgets.

SECTION 2. Additional Cash Match funds for 4 projects (listed below) of \$2,680,000 are contingent upon City Council approval of future fiscal year budgets.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP

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Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
