

AN ORDINANCE 2017-01-19-0020

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,500,000.00 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY/FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY FOR GRANT FUNDS FROM THE 2016 COMPLEX COORDINATED TERRORIST ATTACKS GRANT PROGRAM TO PREPARE FOR, PREVENT AND RESPOND TO COMPLEX COORDINATED TERRORIST ATTACKS; AND AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE FUNDS, UPON AWARD.

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has funds of as much as \$2,500,000.00 available for the 2016 Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attacks (CCTA) grant program; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the CCTA is to enhance the ability of governments to prepare for, prevent, and respond to complex coordinated terrorist attacks; and

WHEREAS, the grant application includes a request for funding of four personnel positions; and

WHEREAS, no matching contribution is required; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to submit a grant application in an amount not to exceed to \$2,500,000.00 for the CCTA grant program for funds from FEMA to assist the City to prepare for, prevent, and respond to complex coordinated terrorist attacks. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to accept said grant, if awarded under substantially the same terms and conditions as applied for. The City Manager and her designee are further authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate said application and acceptance.

SECTION 2. Upon approval of this Ordinance, a new fund and internal order number will be created. Should funding be awarded, the sum of up to \$2,500,000.00 from the FEMA will be appropriated in said fund. The personnel complement of four employees set out in **Exhibit A** is hereby approved.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts, as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.


SECTION 4. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.

Attachment A: 2016 CCTA Grant Ordinance

OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT GRANT POSITION DESCRIPTIONS:

The following 4 positions have been approved by the State as authorized grant-funded positions:

- **Sr. Management Analyst (0999)** - Under administrative direction, this position is responsible for maintaining regional planning and exercise requirements necessary to maintain grant compliance and eligibility.
- **Sr. Management Analyst (0999)** - Under administrative direction, this position will develop and maintain a regional homeland security strategic plan, mutual aid agreements, and other special projects as necessary to support the Homeland Security Grant Program and the San Antonio Urban Area. This position also will support regional emergency management activities.
- **Management Analyst (046)** - Under administrative direction, this position is responsible for assisting in managing homeland security and emergency management exercises including planning, developing, and implementation of a full-scale regional exercise.
- **Management Analyst (046)** - Under administrative direction, this position is responsible for assisting in coordinating homeland security and emergency managing training including Incident Management, Active Shooter, and Stop the Bleed program.
