ORDINANCE

**APPROVING A 2020-2021 NON-SERVICE ALLEY IMPROVEMENTS
TASK ORDER CONTRACT WITH ACE CO IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO
EXCEED \$1,795,961.75 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND
MAINTENANCE OF NON-SERVICE ALLEYS AND RELATED STORM
WATER IMPROVEMENTS LOCATED CITYWIDE.**

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WHEREAS, the 2020-2021 Non-Service Alley Improvements Task Order Contract was solicited to provide unit pricing for the construction, repair and maintenance of non-service alleys and related storm water improvements throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, this contract was advertised for construction bids on January 31, 2020 in the San Antonio Hart Beat, on the City's website, on the Texas Electronic State Business Daily, on TVSA, through the electronic bidding site CIVCAST and through the TCI Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Office, and of the four bidders responding, ACE CO submitted the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, this contract will be awarded in compliance with the SBEDA Program, and the Goal Setting Committee set a 10% Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) subcontracting goal and a 2% African American Business Enterprise (AABE) Subcontracting Goal; and

WHEREAS, requirements for each task shall be detailed in the individual task orders assigned, and the City makes no minimum guarantee pertaining to the volume of work, with all expenditures being in accordance with the FY 2020 Adopted Operating and Capital Budget approved by City Council; **NOW THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to execute a Task Order Contract with ACE CO for construction services related to Non-Service Alley Improvements, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment I.

SECTION 2. (Financial info to be provided.)

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to

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specific Fund Numbers, Project Definitions, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, Fund Centers, Cost Centers, Functional Areas, Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
