Dear Mr. Smith:

The Texas Attorney General (AG) Opinion GA-0988, February 5, 2013, concluded that “Section 364.031 of the Health and Safety Code authorizes cooperative agreements between a municipality and a county that would permit the county to provide mandatory solid waste disposal services in an area of the county that is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the municipality that is not receiving such services from the municipality.”

Pursuant to the aforementioned AG opinion, City staff is recommending that the City of San Antonio allow Bexar County to provide mandatory Solid Waste disposal services in the Camelot II neighborhood which is in the City’s Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). City staff will prepare a City Council Agenda item for City Council consideration of staff’s recommendation for the Council’s August 6, 2015 meeting.
