AN ORDINANCE

AWARDING A CITY COUNCIL PROJECT FUND GRANT ALLOCATION IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$14,400.00 TO THE SAN ANTONIO FOOD BANK FOR HURRICANE HARVEY COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Food Bank was established in 1980 and serves as one of the largest service areas in Southwest Texas, providing meals to over 58,000 individuals on a weekly basis; and .

WHEREAS, on August 25, 2017, Hurricane Harvey struck communities on the Texas coast and inland and the Food Bank worked with the Red Cross and other agencies to assist thousands of evacuees staying at numerous shelters, with meals and water; and dispatched trucks, staff, and other resources to areas in need; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance awards a City Council Project Fund grant allocation in the amount of \$14,400.00 to the Food Bank to assist with the agency's continued efforts to provide relief, food, and water to the thousands of Texas affected by this disaster; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. A grant allocation to the San Antonio Food Bank in an amount not to exceed \$14,400.00, and any additional funding within this fiscal year, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. Funding for this allocation is included in the FY 2017 Adopted General Fund Budget for CCPF. The following contributions were approved to support this allocation.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.
