ORDINANCE

**APPROVING THE REQUIRED TWO-YEAR UPDATE TO THE
2017-2020 WSA LOCAL PLAN FOR SUBMISSION TO THE
TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION**

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WHEREAS, funding for and oversight of workforce development in Texas is provided by the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) through 28 regional workforce boards, including the locally-created Workforce Solutions Alamo (WSA) which services the areas of Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, Medina, and Wilson counties; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio, Bexar County and area county judges (collectively referred to as the “Principals”) are parties to an Interlocal Agreement with WSA through the Chief Elected Officials (CEOs), whereby they oversee the planning, budgeting, administration, and execution of WSA programs in the WSA Service Area; and

WHEREAS, the CEOs have established a “Committee of Six” to carry out some of their duties and responsibilities, which includes the creation and implementation of a four-year WSA Local Plan 2017-2020, as mandated by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act; and

WHEREAS, in early 2017, City Council approved the four-year WSA Local Plan 2017-2020, which requires modifications after two years, as required by TWC, to reflect changes in the labor market and local conditions; and

WHEREAS, the two-year plan update includes a new In-demand Industry and Target Occupation List, as well as revised language to better align the implementation of the plan with changes in economic conditions; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2019, the WSA Board of Directors recommended approval of the SWA Local Plan and on February 27, 2019, the Committee of Six also recommended approval of the WSA Local Plan; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The two-year update to the WSA Local Plan 2017-2020 as recommended by the Committee of Six for submission to the Texas Workforce Commission, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by eight (8) votes or more and upon ten (10) days following its passage if approved by fewer than eight (8) votes.
