


# New HIV Infections

# Global Partnership

- Four core partners
  - City of Paris, IAPAC, UNAIDS, and UN-Habitat
- Cities join and commit to *fast track* efforts to address HIV
  - Accelerate and scale-up local, citywide response
  - Meet global HIV targets by 2020



# Fast-Track Cities



- Launched in 2014 in Paris with 27 cities
- Over 80 cities participating world-wide today
- In the U.S., San Antonio will join
  - Atlanta, Baltimore, Denver, Miami-Dade, New Orleans, NYC, Oakland, Phoenix, Providence, San Francisco, Washington D.C.

# Local Effort

- Joint City and County initiative
- Mayor and Judge participating
- End Stigma End HIV Alliance
  - 27 members from 12 organizations
- Official joining announced during November 30<sup>th</sup> press conference
- 90-90-90 report published by December 1<sup>st</sup>




# FAST-TRACK City Initiative TARGETs

- **90%** of people living with HIV know their status
- **90%** of people with HIV on treatment
- **90%** of people on treatment with suppressed viral loads and not infectious
- **0%** Stigma and discrimination

# How will we achieve 90-90-90?

- Leverage existing programs and resources
- Strategies
  - Routine hospital based HIV testing, such as in emergency departments
  - Targeted education on PREP – Pre-exposure Prophylaxis



# 90-90-90 Plan Strategies



- Centralized eligibility process and/or reduced eligibility paperwork




- Greater health insurance enrollment among people with HIV and those at risk for HIV



# 90-90-90 Plan Strategies

- Increase use of peer mentors, evidence-based navigator programs and promotoras by HIV care providers
- Increase awareness and urgency among local leaders and policymakers
- Elevate community awareness, including awareness as a social justice and health equity concern


