Ban Chokeholds & Strangleholds

Existing Policy

- In 2014, SAPD revised GM-501 to include definition of choke hold and when it may or may not be used.
- It states, "A lateral vascular neck restraint (LVNR) shall not be used unless deadly force is authorized"

Establish Use of Force Continuum

Existing Policy

• The use of force continuum table was included in GM-501 in 2004

OFFICER'S PERCEPTION OF SUSPECT'S ACTIONS

Require De-Escalation

Existing Policy

- De-escalation is a core tenet of the San Antonio Police Department and was first incorporated into the general manual in 2014
- Officers and cadets receive extensive training on de-escalation techniques to ensure officers are able to effectively interact with victims, offenders and individuals in crisis
- All cadets receive crisis intervention training

Duty to Intervene

Existing Policy

General Manual includes a duty to intervene requirement:

 Any officer present and observing another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is reasonable under the circumstances shall safely intercede to prevent the use of such excessive force.

Officers shall immediately report observations to a supervisor

Exhaust All Alternatives Before Shooting

Current SAPD Policy

- Deadly force is authorized only to protect an officer or another person from what is reasonably believed to be an immediate threat of death or serious bodily injury.
- Use of Force Continuum

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Revised SAPD Policy

- Added deadly force will be used with great restraint
- Deadly force as a last resort only when the level of resistance warrants its use
- SAPD places greater value on human life than personal property
- Use of deadly force not allowed to protect property interests

Require Warning Before Shooting

Current SAPD Policy

- De-escalation policy requires officers to de-escalate tense situations to reduce the need for force through:
 - Warnings
 - Advisements
 - Verbal Persuasion
 - Tactics

Revised SAPD Policy

- States more explicitly the requirement to give a verbal warning before using deadly force, including shooting
- Expand on the avoidance of use of deadly force

Require all Use of Force be Reported

Current SAPD Use of Force Policy Policy

- All use of force is reported in the officer's Departmental report; and
- Additional report required if:
 - Greater than empty hand control
 - Injury which requires medical treatment
 - Causes death to an individual
 - Discharging a fire armito an individual
 - Use of an intermediate weapon
 - When Police dog bites individual

- Expands the use of force reporting
 requirement for specific incidents
- Added the following:

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- the pointing of a firearm at an individual
- Reported injury by individual
 Causes any injury to individual

Ban Shooting at Moving Vehicles

Current SAPD Use of Force Policy

 SAPD prohibits officers shooting at a moving vehicle <u>except as the</u> <u>ultimate measure of self-defense or</u> <u>defense of another</u>

Revised SAPD Use of Force Policy

- Added section to specifically address prohibition on discharge of firearm from or at a moving vehicle
- Unless action is necessary for self defense or to protect another person
