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This Certificate of Exemption is executed and filed with the Finance Department as follows:

1. The undersigned is authorized to approve an exemption.
2. An exemption according to Section 252.022 of the Local Government Code exists. More specifically, the following event has occurred:


The Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), one of the City's critical facility, depends on four emergency back up generators and two of which provide emergency power redundancy. During a recent annual testing of these redundant generators, one of the two generator engines experienced a catastrophic failure. Therefore, a replacement engine is needed to maintain the redundancy capability of the emergency power system for PSAP. The replacement cost of the failed engine is estimated at about \$110,000 and it will take about 11 to 13 weeks from the time the purchase order is issued to the equipment manufacturer representative to complete the repair. Only the engine from the manufacturer will work with the other components of the redundant emergency generator.



3. Because the exemption stated above exists, the City of San Antonio intends to contract with Waukesha-Pearce Industrial, INC. which will cost approximately \$ ~~110,000.00~~ 170,648.00
