



Budget Equity Tool

Accomplishments from FY 2020 Budget Equity Tool

1. Advanced racial equity initiatives through **Office of Health Equity** and the **Racial & Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) Grant**
2. Established an **Equity Training Team**
3. Launched the **Department Equity Assessment**

FY 2021 Budget Equity Commitments

1. Embed equity in COVID-19 response and recovery prioritizing the most **marginalized** populations
2. Complete **Department Equity Assessment** and develop an **Equity Action Plan**
3. Improve the inclusion of Black/African-American and other communities of color to help inform **antiracist public health policies**
4. Address racial **health disparities** through cross-departmental collaborations

- Establish stronger efforts to promote racial equity in San Antonio
