# Background

The mission of the Metro Health Immunization Program is to prevent and control transmission of vaccine-preventable diseases in persons of all ages, with an emphasis on individuals at highest risk for under-immunization.





# Background



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Office of Grant Services (OGS) has estimated nationwide funding over the five year period of performance at the below levels:

FY19-FY24 \$1,278,608,775 (nationwide)

This award will start July 1, 2020 and end July 30, 2021

This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the project period

Current total funding will be \$2,410,604.00



# Fiscal Impact

---

- Metro Health will apply for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the project period with a 12 month budget request of \$2,410,604.00.
- The term of the new award will start July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
- There is no impact to the General Fund.


