Grant Summary:

The San Antonio Police Department is seeking grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention not to exceed \$320,000.00 for the grant period October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2022. The Notice Of Funding Availability was received on May 2, 2019 and decision to apply was made on May 15, 2019. There is no cash or in-kind match required. The goal of the grant is to strengthen community capacity to stem violence, reduce youth offending and victimization, improve responses to children's exposure to violence, and enhance public safety. The grant funds being sought will be used to expand and enhance capabilities of the Community Engagement Program within the SAPD Homicide Unit to respond to and support youth victims of gang violence. In particular, the Program will work collaboratively with community-based partners to connect youth victims of gang violence and their families to resources that address the impacts of trauma, provide investigative assistance on gang-involved shootings as victim/community liaisons, and when necessary mediate gang conflicts to prevent retaliation. The grant will also support collaborative community engagement events in areas of high gang activity in order to proactively connect with families impacted by gang violence, strengthen police-community relationships, and sustain reduced youth victimization.
