ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AN ADVANCED FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TXDOT), ACCEPTING REIMBURSEMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,936,000.00 FROM TXDOT FOR CONSTRUCTION RELATED EXPENSES FOR THE ROOSEVELT AVENUE PEDESTRIAN STRUCTURE, AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$23,692.00 TO TXDOT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE OVERSIGHT OF FEDERAL FUNDS.

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WHEREAS, in an effort to increase safety for pedestrians, especially around highly traveled pedestrian areas and transportation site, the Roosevelt Avenue Pedestrian Structure project was selected for funding through the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, Local Agency Managed projects are managed by the City but receive federal funds administered through TxDOT; and

WHEREAS, this Project was selected for funding through the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) as a Local Agency Managed (LAM) project by TxDOT and the City of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, this project will provide for pedestrian connectivity by constructing a pedestrian bridge on the west side of Roosevelt Avenue over the San Antonio River; and

WHEREAS, the City will design and construct the project and receive federal funds administered through TxDOT pursuant to an Advanced Funding Agreement; and

WHEREAS, as a requirement of the TIP, the local agency is responsible for 20% of the construction cost with the remaining 80% being provided federally through TxDOT; and

WHEREAS, the Advanced Funding Agreement will allow construction-related project costs to qualify for federal cost sharing up to the federally approved amount not to exceed \$1,936,000.00 and the City will be responsible for the remaining construction cost of \$484,000.00; and

WHEREAS, when the federal funding reaches the maximum obligated amount of \$1,936,000.00, City will then be responsible for project completion in a timely manner with no additional State or Federal funding and without decreasing the scope and/or terms of the work of the Project; and

WHEREAS, City also will pay \$23,692.00 to TxDOT for administrative oversight of federal funds associated with the project; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance authorizes the execution of an Advanced Funding Agreement between the City of San Antonio and TxDOT, authorizes payment in the not to exceed amount of \$23,692.00 to TxDOT, and accepts reimbursement in the not to exceed amount of \$1,936,000.00 from TxDOT for the Roosevelt Avenue Pedestrian Structure project; **NOW THEREFORE**:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the Transportation and Capital Improvements Department or designee, is hereby authorized to execute an Advanced Funding Agreement between the City of San Antonio and Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) authorizing payment in an amount no to exceed \$23,692.00 payable to TxDOT for administrative oversight of federal funds and accepting grant funds in the amount up to \$1,936,000.00 for the construction of the Roosevelt Avenue Structure Project. A copy of the final agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**.

SECTION 2. When the federal funding reaches the maximum obligated amount, City will then be responsible for project completion in a timely manner with no additional State or Federal funding and without decreasing the scope and/or terms of the work of the Project.

SECTION 3. Should funding be accepted, new funds and internal orders will be created, upon which the award amount of \$1,936,000.00 will be appropriated from TxDOT. A final budget which will include SAP internal Orders and SAP GL Accounts will be submitted by the Transportation and Capital Improvements Department upon acceptance.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Fund Numbers, Project Definitions, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, Fund Centers, Cost Centers, Functional Areas, Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and General Ledger Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective on the en days after passage.
