AN ORDINANCE

**AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT
APPLICATION IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000,000.00 TO
THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, CRIMINAL JUSTICE
DIVISION FOR THE TEXAS ANTI-GANG PROGRAM;
AND AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS,
UPON AWARD.**

WHEREAS, the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division (CJD) has grant funds available to fund the Texas Anti-Gang (TAG) Program, a program that operates a multi-agency task force to combat gang activity in the San Antonio area; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Police Department wishes to apply for grant funds for that purpose in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00; and

WHEREAS, award of the grant would require neither a cash matching contribution, nor an in-kind matching contribution; and

WHEREAS, the grant period would be March 1, 2016, through August 31, 2017; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to submit a grant application in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 to the CJD to fund the TAG Program for the period March 1, 2016, to August 31, 2017. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to accept said grant, if awarded under the same terms and conditions as applied for. The City Manager and her designee are further authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate said application and acceptance.

SECTION 2. Upon acceptance of this award, a new fund and internal order number will be created, upon which the sum of \$1,968,032.00 will be appropriated from CJD. The proposed budget attached hereto as **Exhibit I** is hereby approved.

SECTION 3. The City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of San Antonio to accept said grant. The City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the CJD funds, the City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the CJD in full. The City Council designates the assistant chief of police as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts, as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
