AN ORDINANCE 2019-09-12-0695

CARRYING FORWARD CERTAIN FUNDS, CLOSING ACCOUNTING RECORDS IN CERTAIN FUNDS; AMENDING PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR REQUIREMENTS IN CITY PROJECTS AND DEPARTMENTS; AND APPROPRIATING CERTAIN CAPITAL PROJECT FUNDS

* * * * *

WHEREAS, through Ordinance No. 2018-09-13-0709, passed and approved September 13, 2018 the City Council adopted the annual operating and capital budget for the City of San Antonio for Fiscal Year 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Department provided guidance to and workshops for City Departments on the Fiscal Year 2019 year-end close-out procedures, including assistance in understanding and determining which encumbered balances should be carried forward to Fiscal Year 2020 and which should be cancelled; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to carry forward certain appropriations from the current Fiscal Year, close accounting records for certain funds; and make appropriations for certain other funds; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is part of the City's annual year-end fiscal close-out process; and

WHEREAS the City must comply with requirements of the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) as established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB); and

WHEREAS, the actions authorized by this Ordinance do not increase budgeted expenditures within the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, and such actions are necessary to ensure execution of Fiscal Year 2019 commitments; **NOW THEREFORE**;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. Carry Forward Prior Year Appropriations. That the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget (adopted by Ordinance No. 2019-09-12-0692 dated September 12, 2019) for all funds is hereby increased by the Fiscal Year 2019 ending balance amounts listed in **Attachment I** in the designated accounts, which are hereby appropriated from the unappropriated fund balance of designated funds. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer, is hereby directed to carry forward the actual available ending balance for Fiscal Year 2019 of the accounts listed in **Attachment I.** The actual available ending balance may be lower or higher than the amounts listed in **Attachment I.**

SECTION 2. Carry Forward Prior Years' Encumbrances. That the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget is hereby amended by the amount of Fiscal Year 2019 outstanding encumbrances and earmarks as approved by the Budget Director by the closeout of the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget. In the event any Fiscal Year 2019 outstanding encumbrances or earmarks carried forward into Fiscal Year

2020 are deemed to be unnecessary, then said encumbrances and earmarks are hereby authorized to be canceled and any corresponding appropriations reduced and returned to fund balance. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer, is hereby directed to carry forward the actual available ending balance for Fiscal Year 2019 of the encumbrances and earmarks approved by the Budget Director.

SECTION 3. Close Out Trust & Agency Funds Projects. That any completed projects in Trust and Agency funds identified through the year-end close-out process are hereby authorized to be closed, and any remaining funds are authorized to be appropriated for transfer, if allowable under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), to the appropriate fund(s), including, but not limited to, the General Fund. Any deficit balances can be funded with available surplus funds in applicable operating funds as identified and approved by the Budget Director and Deputy Chief Financial Officer, unless such funding is inconsistent with other legal or accounting requirements.

SECTION 4. Close Out Capital Projects & Grant Projects. That upon completion of each capital project and grant project identified through the year-end close-out process such capital projects and grant projects are hereby authorized to be closed and unencumbered balances or unspent appropriated balances of those projects are hereby authorized to be released in the originating fund. Any remaining cash balances are authorized to be transferred to the General Fund, unless such transfer is inconsistent with other legal or accounting requirements. Any deficit balances can be funded with available surplus balances as identified and approved by the Budget Director and Deputy Chief Financial Officer, unless such transfer is inconsistent with other legal or accounting requirements.

SECTION 5. Close Out Restricted Funds. That upon completion of reconciliation of restricted funds as part of the Fiscal Year 2019 close-out process, remaining positive balances are authorized to be used to offset negative balances, unless such use is inconsistent with other legal or accounting requirements. Any remaining cash balances are authorized to be transferred to the General Fund, unless such transfer is inconsistent with other legal or accounting requirements.

SECTION 6. General Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statements Implementation. That the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, is hereby authorized to take the necessary actions to implement each GASB Statement that is effective and applicable for Fiscal Year 2019.

SECTION 7. Accounting Adjustments. That the Deputy Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to make necessary accounting adjustments to comply with ordinances approved during Fiscal Year 2019, to analyze and report receivables based on collectability, and to write-off specifically identified U.S. Housing and Urban Development grant loan receivables whose funding purpose has been fully satisfied but whose loans are in default and deemed uncollectable due to bankruptcy, foreclosure or death.

SECTION 8. Budget Ordinance Adjustments. That the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget is hereby amended to conform with re-estimates included in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget. Budget adjustments are authorized between funds to reflect actual debt payments and other transfers

originally authorized in the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget and as re-estimated in the proposed Fiscal Year 2020 Budget.

- A. That the 2019-2023 Five-Year Infrastructure Management Plan (IMP) approved September 13, 2018 by Ordinance 2018-09-13-0709 is hereby amended with regard to the list of street projects and concurrence memos included as Attachment 2.
- B. Funds in the amount of \$188.858 are authorized to be appropriated from the Riverbarge Improvement Fund 29093001 for consultants and purchases related to the riverbarges.

SECTION 9. Temporary Fund Transfers. That the Deputy Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to temporarily transfer funds to various Funds with negative cash balances at the end of Fiscal Year 2019 from the General Fund ending cash balance, and/or cash balances from other City Funds if necessary, for financial statement presentation and for compliance with GAAP, provided that said transfer shall be reversed within ten (10) working days.

SECTION 10. Budget Ordinances Amendments. That the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance No. 2018-09-13-0709, passed and approved September 13, 2018, and the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance No. 2019-09-12-0692 passed and approved September 12, 2019, is each hereby amended in accordance with the provisions set forth above.

SECTION 11. Effective Date. Except as otherwise provided for herein, this Ordinance is effective immediately, upon passage by eight (8) affirmative votes; otherwise said effective date shall be ten (10) days from the date of passage hereof.

Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) has four alley maintenance projects scheduled for the FY 2019 IMP as listed in the table below. The concrete surfaces on the four alleys preclude the need for the level of maintenance required on other alleys in the proximate area at this time. TCI staff recommends removing the four alleys with concrete applications from the FY 2019 IMP and replacing them with the six alley projects listed on the second table below. The six recommended alleys include five accelerated existing projects from FY 2022 and one newly recommended project. Since these changes impact the IMP adopted as part of the FY 2019 budget, your concurrence will complete this action.

Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) has a sidewalk construction project on both sides of Avenue B from Tuleta Drive to the Dead End scheduled for FY 2019 IMP. The Avenue B project conflicts with Parks and Recreation development over the same area. Staff attempted a coordinated multiphase effort, but on-going environmental studies and other Master Plan requirements make this project unfeasible at this time. Staff recommends deferring our Avenue B project to FY 2021, and adding the three projects listed in the table below to fill the resulting gap in the FY 2019 IMP budget. Since these changes impact the IMP adopted as part of the FY 2019 budget, your concurrence will complete this action.

The impact of these changes on the allocated budget for FY 2019 IMP is insignificant. There will be adjustments for any changes that will leave a negative or positive balance during the FY 2020 - FY 2024 IMP development.

Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) had scheduled to construct sidewalks on both the east and west side of Ronda Street from Shasta Avenue to the cul-de-sac scheduled in the FY 2019 IMP. Contractors constructed the sidewalks on the east side of Ronda Street. In coordination with the District Office, staff determined that it was unnecessary to construct sidewalks on the strip mall side (west side). Consequently, TCI is seeking authorization to utilize the allocated budget for construction of sidewalks on the north side of Hot Wells Boulevard from Clark Avenue to Pyle Street. Since these changes impact IMP funds adopted as part of the FY 2019 budget, your concurrence is needed to complete this action.

Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) currently has four sidewalk projects in fiscal year (FY) 2019 listed below. Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) has a street preservation project on Raintree Path from Toepperwein Road to the dead-end, and another one on Westface Street from Raintree Path to the cul-de-sac scheduled in the FY 2019 IMP. TCI staff conducted an investigation and determined that a fog seal is not the appropriate application for these streets based on pavement conditions. Staff recommends deferring both of these projects to FY 2020 for a rehabilitation project, and accelerating three other fog seal projects to fill the resulting gap in the FY 2019 budget. Since these changes impact the IMP adopted as part of the FY 2019 budget, your concurrence will complete this action.

The impact of these changes on the allocated budget for FY 2019 IMP is insignificant. There will be adjustments for any changes that will leave a negative or positive balance during the FY 2020 – FY 2024 IMP development.
