The San Antonio Conservation Society supports historic designation of the proposed Greenlawn Estates Historic District. This pre-World War II neighborhood is unique in its retention of large lots. It is also significant for the integrity of its eclectic houses, which were built in a variety of architectural styles that span the decades.

In 1927, San Antonio homebuilder Otto Klaus developed the block of Greenlawn Drive located on the west side of IH-10, between the frontage road and Vance Jackson, promoting it as a suburban oasis. Greenlawn was one of the first subdivisions to offer city improvements and utilities outside the city limits.

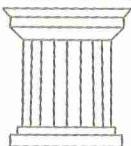
The essence of Klaus' plan remains extant within this block, which features large lots with wide setbacks and swaths of green space, despite experiencing over forty years of subsequent development. Historic designation of this district will ensure that the neighborhood can continue to preserve its unique and defining characteristics.
