

ORDINANCE 2021 - 04 - 29 - 0280

**APPROVING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION
AND ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO
EXCEED \$30,000.00, FROM THE TEXAS HISTORICAL
COMMISSION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STRATEGIC
PLAN FOR CULTURAL CONTEXT STATEMENTS.**

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WHEREAS, the City’s Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) is committed to developing innovative processes and methods that allow citizens to tell their own stories and act as “the experts” in communicating the historic resources that matter to them; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Historical Commission (THC) offers grants to local governments to develop and sustain effective local preservation programs; and

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2020, OHP applied for a grant to develop a strategic plan for the development of cultural context statements that will include a gap analysis and best practices for collaborative, inclusive, and equitable processes, which will focus on underrepresented communities; and

WHEREAS, the public engagement process for this strategic plan will include multigenerational stakeholders, community workshops, focus groups, and public review; and

WHEREAS, the plan will provide the OHP guidance on prioritizing cultural context statements and will produce the first cultural context statement; and

WHEREAS, the THC has preliminarily awarded the City a cost reimbursement grant of \$30,000.00 and the match requirement will be met with in-kind services; **NOW THEREFORE**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The submission of a grant application to the Texas Historic Commission is hereby approved. The City Manager or designee or the Director of the Office of Historic Preservation or designee is hereby authorized to accept grant funds upon award, not to exceed \$30,000.00, for the development of a strategic plan for cultural context statements and one completed cultural context statement with an estimated completion date of September 2022. A copy of said application is on file with the Office of Historic Preservation.

SECTION 2. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the Office of Historic Preservation or designee, is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said application and acceptance.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance also authorizes an in-kind match of the lesser of \$30,000.00 or 50% of eligible costs which will be fulfilled by salaries.


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SECTION 4 Upon acceptance of this award, new funds and internal order numbers will be created, upon which the award amount not to exceed \$30,000.00 will be appropriated in said funds. A final budget, including Internal Orders and GL Accounts, will be submitted by the Office of Historic Preservation upon award.

SECTION 5. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.


