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This Certificate of Exemption is executed and filed with the Finance Department as follows:

1. The undersigned is authorized to approve an exemption.
2. An exemption according to Section 252.022 of the Local Government Code exists. More specifically, the following event has occurred:

On May 22, 2019 a catastrophic failure of the PDI static transfer switch (STS) located within the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) occurred which resulted in an outage at the PSAP 911 Call Center. Personnel from the PSAP have been temporarily relocated to the Bexar Metro 911 Regional Operations Center. On June 18, 2019, the Information Technology Services Department (ITSD) and the City's Building Equipment Services Department (BESD) secured a final quote from Big State Electric, LTD to replace the PDI STS with a new Liebert (STS) as well as adding and installing new manual bypass switch in support of future STS maintenance activities. This contract will also pre-pay for a maintenance and support agreement of the newly installed Liebert static transfer switch for a period of five years. In order to accomplish this work, it has become necessary to order and pay for services in advance of City Council action; therefore, a ratification of the contract with Big State Electric, LTD will be required. It is anticipated that this item will be presented to City Council in early August.

3. Because the exemption stated above exists, the City of San Antonio intends to contract with Big State Electric, LTD. which will cost approximately \$ 126,920.00.
