Purpose

Pilot partnership between the San Antonio Police Department, San Antonio Fire Department and the Center for Health Care Services launched on July 1, 2019

- Identify chronic mental health consumers
- Reduce emergency detentions
- Provide ongoing treatment and wrap-around care
- Develop tailored services to meet patient needs

Goal

Reduce the number of emergency detentions and provide mental health consumers with resources and referrals to ensure long-term stability and health

- Target Group – 100 mental health consumers with minimum of 6 emergency detentions during previous six month period
- Average individual monthly emergency detentions reduced to .39 per month through February 2020



Outcomes

Since the launch of the program in July 2019, a total of 65 individuals have transitioned out of the PICC:

Outcome	Number of Consumers
Achieve Stability/Relocate with Family	33
Incarcerated	17
Unable to Locate	14
Deceased	1



Recommendation

Acceptance of funds from the Southwest Regional Advisory Council (STRAC) in the amount up to \$384,478 to support the continuation of the Program for Intensive Care Coordination (PICC) through December 31, 2020.
