Brief Description of Item(s) and Use:

This contract will provide the Emergency Medical Services Division (EMS) of the Fire Department with X Series monitor/defibrillator equipment and supplies for the cardiac monitors/defibrillators deployed on all EMS ambulances and first command respond vehicles. These supplies are required to maintain the X Series monitors/defibrillators purchased in FY 2013 at peak functionality whenever first responders are accessing a patient's cardiac rhythm, measuring patient vital signs, administrating electric defibrillation charges when needed, and transmitting electrocardiogram (EKG) data to hospitals in advance of arrival. Equipment and supplies include expansion packs, cables, connectors, batteries, and chargers.

These items are being procured as Sole Source according to the provisions of Texas Statutes Local Government Code 252.022.07. No other source can supply the items listed nor can any comparable item fulfill the same requirements. Vendor acknowledges, with his/her signature, that all items offered are considered a Sole Source.

Comments:	In FY 2013, the San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) purchased 60 X Series 12 Lead cardiac monitors/defibrillators to provide cardiac assessment and subsequent treatment of patients experiencing cardiac arrest symptoms. These supplies will support the functionality of the monitors.
Anticipated Future Requirements and Action:	N/A
Procurement Alternative:	Should this contract not be approved, the EMS Division of the Fire Department would be required to purchase equipment and supplies as requirements arise. Without operational monitors/defibrillators, the EMS Division will not be able to provide critical cardiac treatment on patients who are experiencing cardiac arrest symptoms.
