AN ORDINANCE

ACCEPTING THE LOWEST REPSONSIVE BID AND AWARDING A TASK ORDER CONTRACT TO D&G ENERGY CORPORATION, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,584,764.85, FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNAL SYSTEMS AND OTHER TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES THROUGHOUT THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

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WHEREAS, each year traffic signals and other projects are constructed to address specific traffic or pedestrian safety needs including the installation of traffic signals, pedestrian hybrid beacons, school flashers, Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) devices, and other related work; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation & Capital Improvements Department advertised for construction bids for this contract in July/August 2017, in the San Antonio Hart Beat, on the City's website, on the Texas Electronic State Business Daily, and on TVSA; and

WHEREAS, three (3) bidders responded to the request for bids for Package B with D&G Energy Corporation being the lowest responsive bidder with a bid amount of \$2,584,764.85; and

WHEREAS, D&G Energy Corporation has provided these services to the City previously and is familiar with the types of projects this contract entails; and

WHEREAS, these contracts will be awarded in compliance with the Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Program, which requires contracts be reviewed by a Goal Setting Committee to establish a requirement and/or incentive unique to the particular contract in an effort to maximize the amount of small, minority, and women-owned business participation on the contract; and

WHEREAS, expenditures for these services are subject to available funding and are authorized by individual projects at the time work is requested or project funds are appropriated through ordinance, and requirements for each task shall be detailed in the individual work orders assigned, and City makes no minimum guarantee pertaining to the volume of work; and

WHEREAS, if funding for any work activities is not previously appropriated, funding will be identified and appropriated through subsequent City Council action, and potential funding sources for individual work orders include, but are not limited to, the Advanced Transportation District (ATD), and the General Fund; **NOW THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The lowest responsive bid of **D&G Energy Corporation** in the amount not to exceed **\$2,584,764.85** for projects in support of the installation of Traffic Signal Systems and other devices throughout the City is hereby approved. All other bids will be considered rejected upon the execution of a contract by the successful bidder and the deposit of all required bonds and insurance certificates or the expiration of ninety (90) days from the effective date hereof, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 2. The Task Order Contract is hereby awarded to **D&G Energy Corporation**.

SECTION 3. The amount up to \$2,584,764.85 will be encumbered upon issuance of purchase orders, and payment is authorized to **D&G Energy Corporation**. All expenditures will be in accordance with the Fiscal Year 2017 and subsequent budgets that fall within the term period of this contract approved by City Council.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by eight or more affirmative votes; otherwise, it shall be effective on the tenth day after passage.
