Brief Description of Item(s) and Use:

This contract will provide Animal Care Services (ACS) with a supplier for the purchase and delivery of registered microchips. These items can be utilized as a permanent form of licensing and as a way to identify animals in the event they become lost or stolen. All animals reclaimed by their owner or adopted from ACS are microchipped, unless medically prohibited. Our current microchips are not registered, which passes the responsibility of registering the microchip to the pet owner. Registered microchips will be recorded in a National Pet Recovery System listing contact information for the pet's owner, alternate contact information for the pet owner, and veterinarian information shortly after the adoption is finalized. Registered microchips play a vital role in ensuring lost pets are returned to their owners. By recording the pet owner's contact information with the microchip provider, Animal Care Services will have enhanced resources to help ensure the pet is returned to their family. In addition to increasing the shelter's live release rate, these pet-owner reunions ease shelter overcrowding by facilitating positive outcomes earlier.
