Brief Description of Item(s) and Use:

This contract will provide Center City Development and Operations, Parks & Recreation, Convention and Sports Facilities and San Antonio Public Library Departments with a contractor to furnish all labor necessary to install, maintain, and remove City-owned LED holiday lighting on assorted trees, structures and statues located in Downtown San Antonio. The service will include, but is not limited to, the installation, maintenance, and removal of holiday lighting and running power cable(s) to fixed or temporary electrical panels. This contract also includes an option for City to rent various holiday lighting such as C-9 LED, LED Minibulbs and C-7 LED lights from the Contractor. Contractor will supply timers as needed to turn lights on at dusk and off at dawn, or as city requires.
