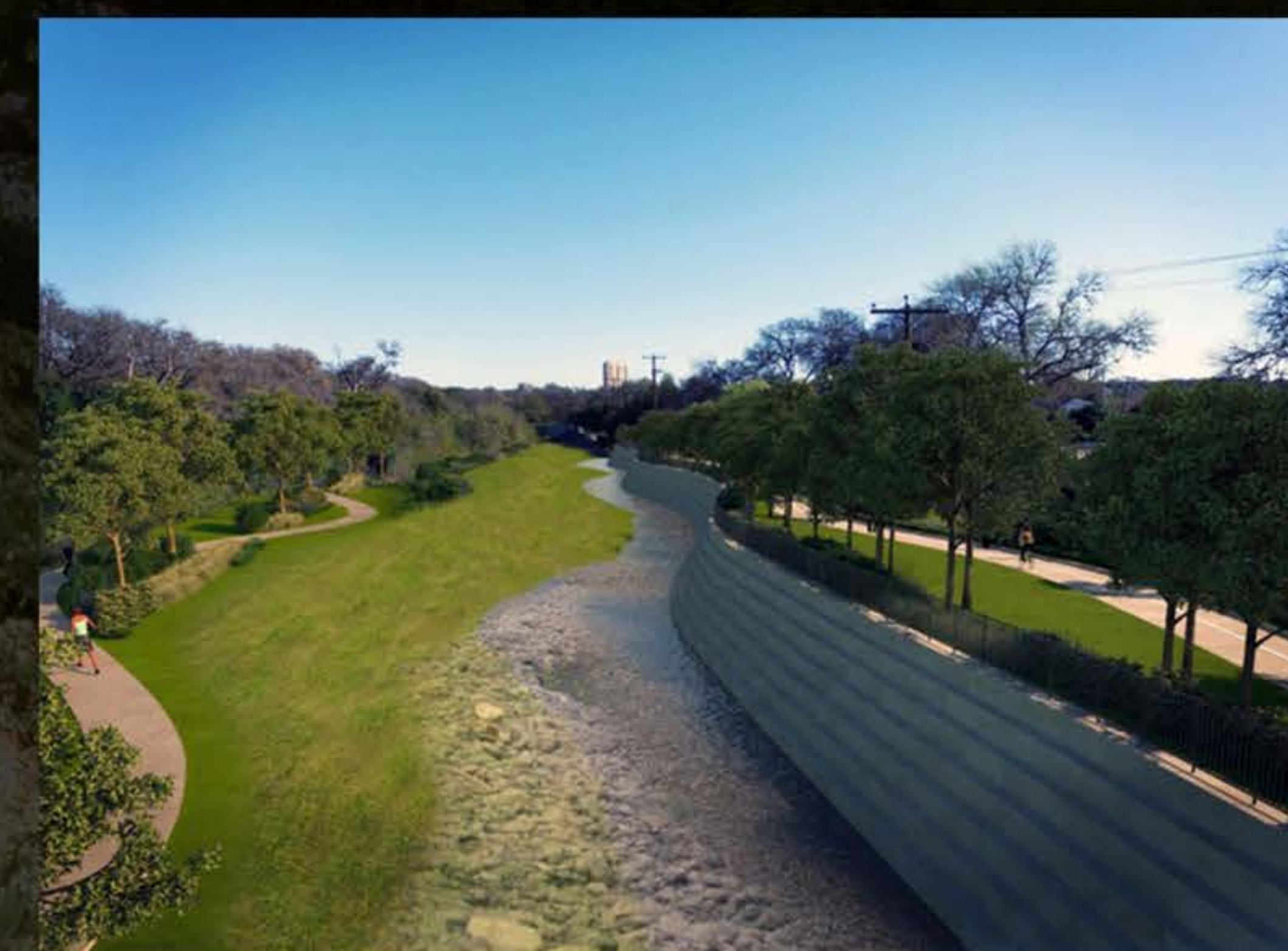

2. RESTORE, PRESERVE, AND ARTICULATE PARK CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL FEATURES



NATIONAL HERITAGE AREA

Through public-private partnerships, NHA entities support historic preservation, natural resource conservation, recreation, heritage tourism, and educational projects. Leveraging funds and long-term support for projects.

National Park Service partners provide technical assistance, and distributes MATCHING FEDERAL FUNDS from Congress to NHA entities.

EXAMPLES:

Abraham Lincoln NHA, Illinois
Northern Rio Grande NHA, New Mexico
Freedoms Frontier, Oklahoma
Baltimore NHA, Maryland

NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK

This designation helps recognize, preserve, and protect important locations in American history. Designating a property as an NHL may provide it with additional protection from development, and may also make the property eligible for preservation grants and technical preservation assistance.

EXAMPLES:

NHL sites in this region include the Hoover Dam, United States Air Force Academy, Georgia O'Keeffe Home and Studio to name a few.

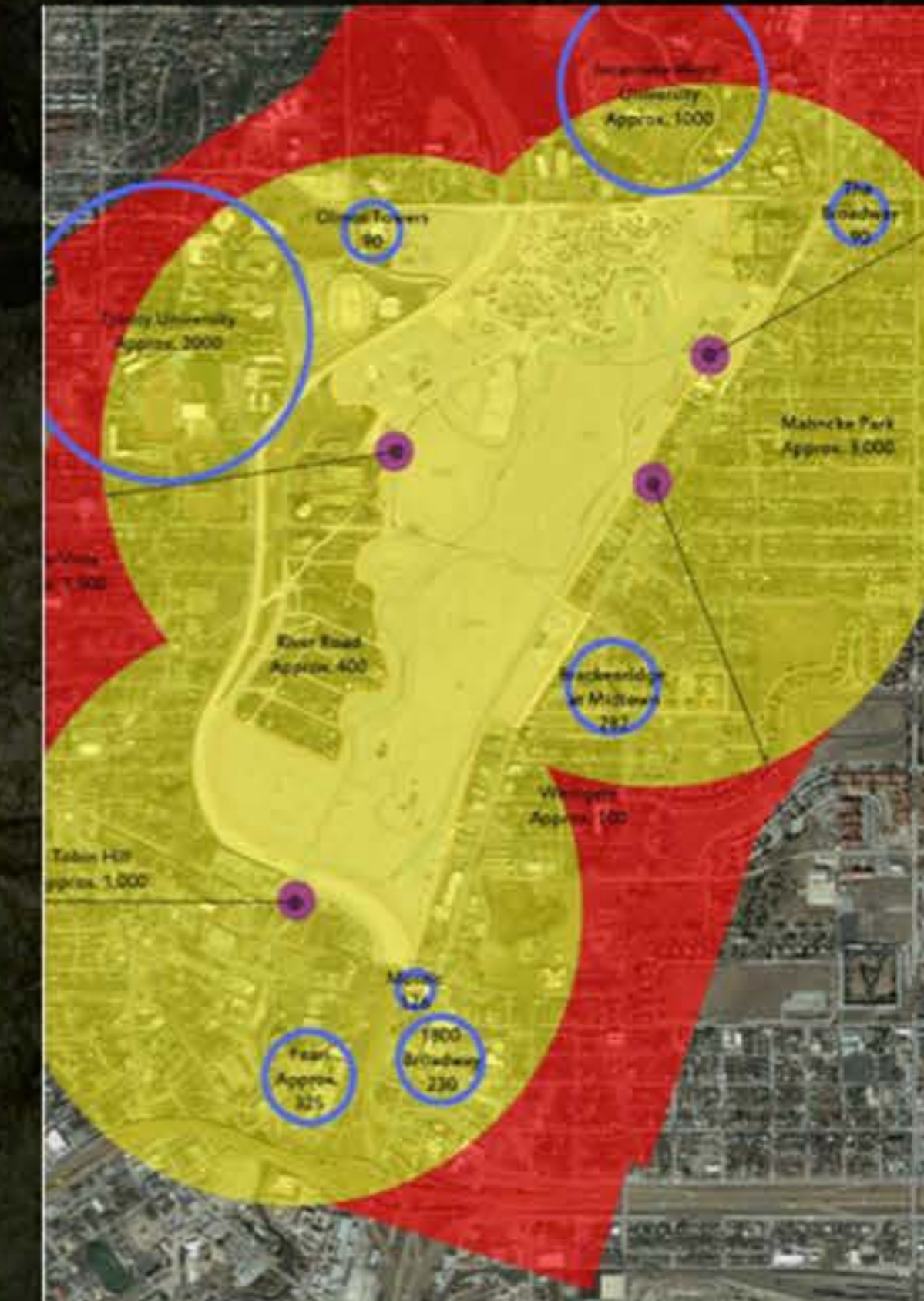

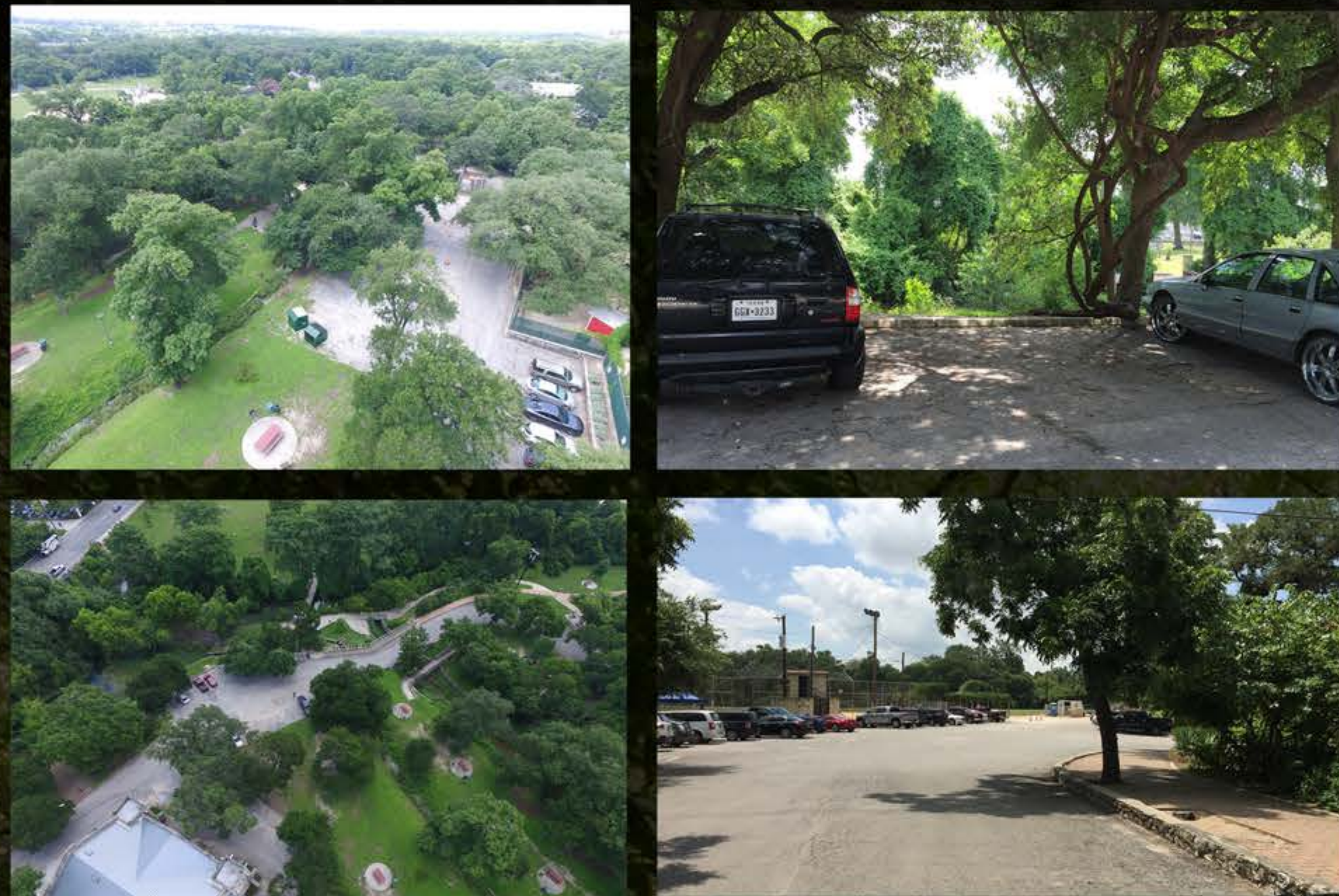

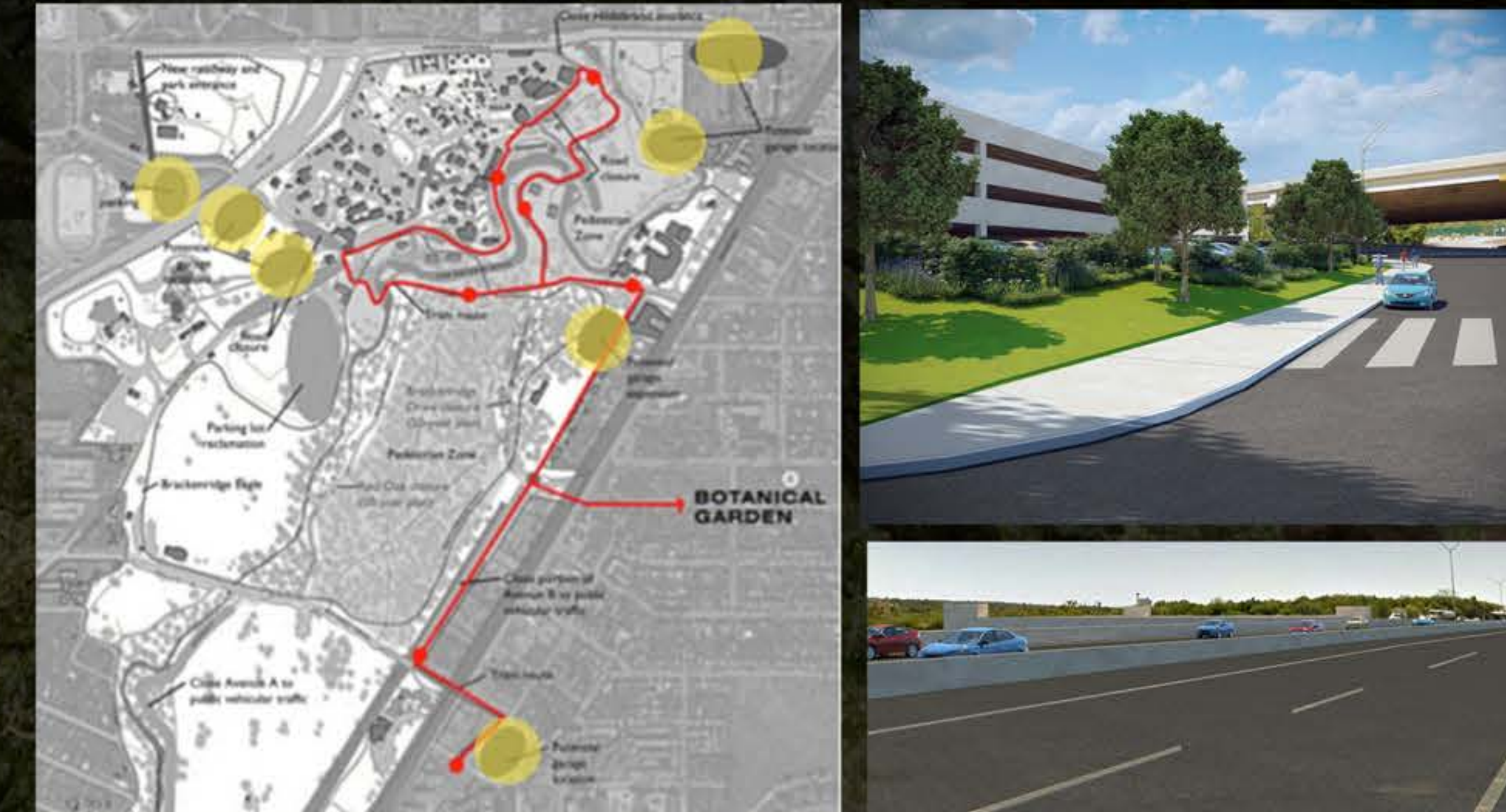

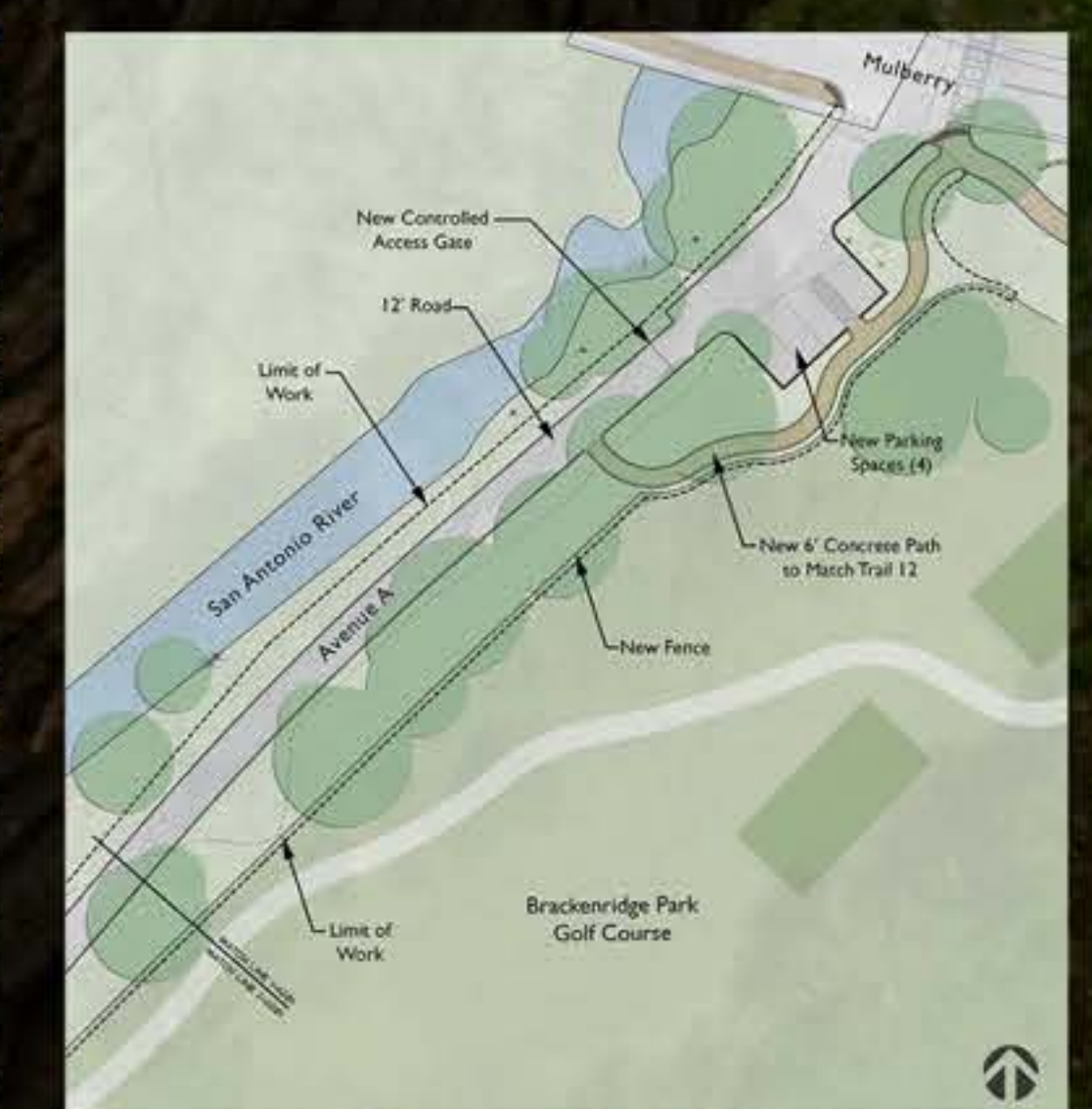
5C. MID- BLOCK TURNAROUND ON RED OAK
