AUTHORIZING AGREEMENTS WITH THE TEXAS A&M FOREST SERVICE TO PROVIDE FUEL REDUCTION SERVICES TO MITIGATE WILDFIRE RISKS TO THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

WHEREAS, wildfire threats are increasing in urban areas, putting homes, lives, infrastructure, and resources at risk; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio is particularly vulnerable to wildfire because of its extensive undeveloped land within its boundaries and the frequent drought conditions it experiences; and

WHEREAS, the Texas A&M Forest Service has offered to provide fuel reduction services to the City to mitigate the wildfire risk; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code authorizes agreements between local governments and agencies of the state; **NOW THEREFORE**:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager and her designated representative are hereby authorized to execute interlocal agreements with the Texas A&M Forest Service, in substantially the same form as that agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit I**, to provide for fuel reduction services to mitigate the wildfire risk to the City of San Antonio.

SOLE, JOINT, OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE, NEGLIGENCE PER SE, STATUTORY FAULT, OR STRICT LIABILITY OF TFS AND ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND REPRESENTATIVES.

In addition, CITY makes the following representations and acknowledgements upon which TFS shall rely:

(1) CITY and its agents, servants and employees are not agents, servants, or employees of TFS or the State of Texas, and are not covered by TFS or the State for workers' compensation, death, or disability benefits;

(2) CITY agrees that CITY's agents, servants and employees will not be under the influence of any substance that may impair mental and physical faculties while present for any part of the Service;

(3) In signing this agreement the undersigned representative of CITY acknowledges and represents that s/he has read it, understands it, and signs it voluntarily as an authorized representative of CITY;

(4) TFS has not made, and CITY has not relied on, any oral representations, statements, or inducements apart from the express written statements, contained in this agreement; and

(5) CITY executes this agreement, for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by the same, now and in the future.

4.3 This Agreement may only be amended or modified in writing with express mutual consent of both parties.

4.4 All notices, consents, approvals, demands, requests, or other communications provided for, required of, or permitted to be given under any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given or served when delivered by hand delivery, delivered by an express delivery service, or when deposited in the U.S. mail by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:

SUBJECT:

Agreement to Perform Services on Public Lands with Texas A&M Forest Service (TFS)

SUMMARY:

Ordinance authorizing agreements with the Texas A&M Forest Service (TFS) to provide state resources to mitigate wildfire threats to the City. TFS will also provide free wildfire training for SAFD firefighters.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Wildfire threats are increasing in urban areas, often repeatedly, putting more homes, lives, infrastructure, and other resources at risk. More than 15,000 wildfires burned in the continental United States from 2000 to 2014. During these years, 127 urban areas (cities with more than 75,000 residents) were threatened by major wildfires (fires greater than 5 square miles in area) that burned within 10 miles of the city limits. San Antonio is particularly vulnerable to wildfire because of its extensive undeveloped land within city boundaries and frequent drought conditions.

TFS approved the City's Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) on July 27, 2016. In this plan, there are more than 600 City parks and neighborhoods identified within City limits that are at some level of threat from a wildfire. Upon approval of this ordinance, TFS will coordinate with San Antonio Office of Emergency Management (SAOEM) to develop fuel reduction projects to mitigate the wildfire risk to our community.

Wildfires increasingly are expensive and dangerous, burning homes, and consuming agency budgets. Attempts to mitigate wildfire risk, such as voluntary landowner education and fuels reduction, while important, alone are

insufficient for the magnitude of the growing wildfire danger, which is exacerbated by a warming climate and continued home building. This Agreement will help offset the City's cost in preparing for and responding to a wildfire. In addition, area firefighters will have the opportunity to train with TFS while working on a fuel reduction project.

ISSUE:

The City does not have an agreement with TFS for wildfire support and therefore has limited or no access to state grant funding or resources to assist with wildfire prevention and training.

ALTERNATIVES:

The alternative is to increase the number of City firefighters who are trained to fight wildfires.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no immediate fiscal impact to the General Fund; however, mitigation of wildfire threats in our City could reduce the financial impact from future wildfire incidents.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance and authorizes the San Antonio Fire Chief to enter into agreements with the Texas A&M Forest Service to perform wildfire mitigation, training, and related activities on public lands in San Antonio.
