Description of Event/Purpose (Describe in 200-300 words):

Musical Bridges Around the World's (MBAW) vehicle for educational outreach programming, Kids to Concerts (KtC), is an interactive, multicultural concert series for students in grades K-12, embedding the inimitable experience of live performing arts directly into San Antonio schools, at no charge to schools visited. The purpose of the KtC program is to introduce children to world cultures through music and dance. This experience expands the awareness of culturally underserved San Antonio students. encouraging artistic appreciation, and supporting their evolution into well-rounded, culturally aware citizens.

Presently, most San Antonio public schools do not have the funds to provide live music experiences, as outlined in TEKS and National Academic Standards. MBAW's KtC program provides high quality, interactive international folk music experiences, meeting requirements for TEKS, STEM, and National Academic Standards in Music, Art, and Social Studies, without the logistical challenge and high cost of transporting students. The KtC program objectives are: to introduce children to other cultures through international folk music at its best; to promote peace and respect for cultural differences; and to assist teachers and schools in fulfilling State and National Academic Standards.

In 2016-2017, MBAW will be introducing San Antonio elementary school students to Russia, Argentina, Ukraine, France, Spain, Senegal, & Czech Republic. We are thrilled to bring three to five internationally known artists from each culture to underprivileged students in San Antonio public schools, including among others: Russian/Ukrainian folk ensemble the Flying Balalaika Brothers, Galician accordian player Victor Prieto, Senegalese musician Abdou Mboup, and Czech Clarinetist Felix Slovak, Jr. All artists are world-renowned musicians and experts in their genres. We will be bringing 40 concerts to city districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10 & Mayor from October 2016 to January 18, 2017 and 8 school concerts to district 6 from October 2016 to June 2017.

MBAW would like to bring our educational outreach program KtC to each city District as many concerts as can be sponsored, at \$1,200 per concert. Our wait list for this year has already reached 116 schools and we hope to be able to serve as many as possible. We are respectfully requesting funding for 4 school concerts in Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10 & Mayor at a cost of \$4,800 each district; and 8 school concerts in District 6 at a cost of \$9,600.

### **Requested Funds Program Description:**

**Kids to Concerts (KtC)** is a free educational outreach program designed by *Musical Bridges Around the World (MBAW)* annually benefiting more than 50,000 children in grades K-12 through interactive, multicultural musical and dance performances by world-class artists of the highest caliber.

This program is the first of its kind in the area, and is regularly praised by educators and children alike. **KtC** provides interactive concerts for children while integrating Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) and Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) compliant curricula with the inimitable experience of live performing arts.

Public education continually faces billions of dollars in proposed budget cuts, slashing and in some cases eliminating funding for music and arts education. *MBAW* helps fill the void of music and arts education in public schools, providing engaging and culturally edifying presentations.

**KtC** brings the rare, precious experience of live art -- integrating music and dance with science, technology, engineering, and math -- to San Antonio children who would otherwise not have this opportunity. With bright costumes, unique instruments, short educational videos, and the vibrant energy of live performance, diverse traditions and music come alive for students. Research shows that music education improves overall academic performance. These concerts enhance the students education while broadening their world view.

Last year MBAW introduced children from 54 San Antonio schools to Lebanon, India, Columbia, Japan, Russia & Syria. MBAW hopes to expand the reach of this program once again by taking children from 88 schools on a musical journey through Russia, Ukraine, France, Spain, Africa, & Czech Republic throughout the next season. Each segment will include 3 to 5 guest artists from each respective culture. Guest artists for KtC 2016-2017 include among others:

Grammy Winner Victor Prieto collaborates on world stages with Yo-Yo Ma, Arturo O'Farrill Latin Jazz Orchestra, Cristina Pato, The Maria Schneider Orchestra, Valinor Quartet, Paquito D'Rivera, Chris Cheek, and Christian Howes Group. He teaches Master Classes in US Berklee College of Music, Spain, Italy, Portugal and has headed the jazz accordion studies at the Brooklyn Conservatory, New York.


### Abdou Mboup
