

**AN ORDINANCE**

**SELECTING RAMBOLL ENVIRON US CORPORATION, AND AWARDING A CONTRACT FOR SERVICES FOR “HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENT FOR NON-ATTAINMENT ON PUBLIC HEALTH”, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$74,443.00, FOR AN INITIAL TERM OF ONE YEAR, WITH ONE ADDITIONAL ONE YEAR RENEWAL OPTION**

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**WHEREAS**, the Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG) has a study being developed that will detail the direct and indirect economic cost for non-attainment and, as a companion study, the City will undertake a study to estimate the direct and indirect costs of asthma and other ozone-related illnesses on the general public, especially school-age children, to assess the public health impact and costs of ozone non-attainment; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 3, 2017, the City issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a “Health Impact Assessment for Non-Attainment on Public Health” (RFP 17-038), one proposal response was received, which was evaluated and scored by a committee consisting of representatives from the Office of Sustainability, San Antonio Metro Health and the Alamo Area Council of Governments, and, based on the evaluation made in the selection process, staff recommends awarding a contract to Ramboll Environ US Corporation, as the most qualified respondent; and

**WHEREAS**, under this agreement, Ramboll Environ US Corporation will develop a “Health Impact Assessment for Non-Attainment on Public Health” study that will complement the AACOG “Economic Cost of Non-Attainment Study” and the SA Tomorrow Sustainability Plan, and will be complete within ninety days after Council approval; and

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance authorizes the selection of Ramboll Environ US Corporation, and awards a contract to provide the Office of Sustainability and the Health Department with “Health Impact Assessment for Non-Attainment on Public Health” (RFP 17-038) services, for an initial term of one year with one one-year renewal option, in an amount not to exceed \$74,443.00; **NOW THEREFORE**,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1.** Ramboll Environ US Corporation is hereby selected to provide services in relation to the “Health Impact Assessment for Non-Attainment on Public Health” (RFP 17-038) for the City of San Antonio as the most qualified respondent to the Request for Proposals.

**SECTION 2.** The City Manager, or her designee, or the Director, Office of Sustainability, or his designee, is hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to negotiate and execute an Agreement with Ramboll Environ US Corporation for a term of one year, with the option for the City to extend the contract for one additional one-year term, under the same terms and conditions, in an amount not to exceed \$74,443.00. The initial term of the Agreement shall begin after approval by the City and shall end on March 8, 2018. A copy of the Agreement, in

substantially final form, is attached and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**. The execution authority granted by this ordinance shall expire 60 days from the effective date.

**SECTION 3.** Funding in the amount of \$75,000.00 for this ordinance is available in Fund 55001000, Cost Center 8055010001 and General Ledger 5201040, as part of the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget. Additional funding for this ordinance is contingent upon City Council approval of the City's operating budget and the availability of funds for subsequent Fiscal Years

**SECTION 4:** Payment not to exceed of \$75,000.00 is authorized Ramboll Environ US Corporation and should be encumbered with a purchase order.

**SECTION 5.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6.** This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by eight affirmative votes; otherwise it shall be effective on the tenth day after passage hereof.
