Background

- Metro Health currently implements Stand Up S.A., a violence prevention project, funded by the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division.
- Stand Up S.A.
 - A program designed to prevent violence by treating the issue like an infectious disease.
 - Uses the Cure Violence model, an evidenced-based public health approach to reduce and prevent violence in our streets.
 - Focuses on interrupting transmission, changing behaviors and community norms.
- The current funding will end on March 31, 2017.



Background

- The U.S Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention seeks proposals for the Safe and Thriving Communities Grant.
- Funding supports efforts to develop comprehensive prevention, public health and safety plans to address violence in homes, schools, and communities.
- Selected communities would strengthen capacity to collaboratively plan, align, and execute community-driven approaches focused on a shared framework:
 - Prevention; intervention; providing opportunities; and community development.



Fiscal Impact

- This Grant is an initial 18 month award in an amount up to \$333,000 beginning October 1, 2017 through March 31, 2019 to support planning.
- There is no impact on the General Fund.



Recommendation

 Staff recommends the approval of submission of the application, and acceptance of funds if awarded, for the U.S Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, Safe and Thriving Communities: Planning and Collaboration grant.
