# Streets, Bridges & Sidewalks 64 Projects | \$445,263,000

Projects to construct or improve streets and street amenities, sidewalks and multimodal facilities in coordination with established transportation plans and other agencies.

- Road reconstruction and widening
- Utilities
- Pedestrian Safety
- Medians, turn lanes, multi-use/bike paths
- Curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches



# Drainage & Flood Control 19 Projects | \$138,988,000

Projects to improve or develop storm water drainage systems to include detention basins, channels, low-water crossing improvements, and other drainage projects in coordination with the Bexar Regional Watershed Management Program.

- Underground stormwater drainage
- Channels
- Water detention



# Parks, Recreation & Open Spaces

79 Projects | \$187,313,000

Projects that acquire, develop or renovate parks and park facilities/amenities including but not limited to swimming pools, community recreation and gymnasium facilities, ballfields, trails and open spaces in coordination with established park system plans.



# Libraries & Cultural Facilities 13 Projects | \$24,025,000

Projects that acquire, construct, improve, renovate and equip libraries, cultural facilities and other facilities.



# Public Safety Facilities 5 Projects | \$34,411,000

Projects that acquire, construct, improve, renovate and equip public safety facilities to include fire, police, emergency medical services and other facilities promoting the health, safety and welfare of the City's residents.

- Comprehensive facility renovations
- Construction of new facilities
- Acquisition of facilities for community use



## Neighborhood Improvements

#### 12 Areas | \$20,000,000

- City purchases distressed properties in one or more of 12 eligible areas
- City demolishes dilapidated structures, abates environmental issues, extends utilizes and improves surrounding sidewalks/streets
- Properties are sold to nonprofit and private developers to build workforce housing (single-family, multi-family or mixed-use projects)


