



## Cornerstone Laying at Shiloh Baptist, Sunday

THE NEW EDIFICE OF THE SHILOH BAPTIST CHURCH

Shiloh Baptist church, the Rev. Shelly Edward Steward, pastor, will, on Sunday, April 15, at 3:30 o'clock, conduct a dual program, with there being formal cornerstone laying ceremonies for the new church edifice, and with the church celebrating the eleventh anniversary of the founding of the church—on April 15, 1934—by Rev. Steward.

The Shiloh membership has been swelled by 400 additions, and progress in every direction has been made.

All the pastors and congregations of the city are being invited and urged to worship with Shiloh, Sunday, at 3:30. Rev. I. C. Green will deliver the sermon, and the Friendship Baptist church choir will furnish music. Rev. G. C. Coleman and the Palestine choir and congregation will also participate in the program.

Shiloh may be reached by riding the S. P. bus to Rio Grande—the end of the line—and then walking south, three blocks. The Iowa bus may be ridden to Nebraska and Walters streets, and then walk east on Nebraska to Florence.

Don't let the price mislead you. These are not cheap overalls, but real strong, sturdy, heavy garments, which were originally government property, made for the U. S. A., since disbanded, and on which the O.P.A. ceiling in a regular way would be \$4.49. Note these features: Heavy 8-oz. white terylene, unlined, drop seats, genuine steel butt joints, safety guards on ankles, belted, all double stitched pockets, 4 extra big pockets, all buttons blinded, sizes 10 to 20.
