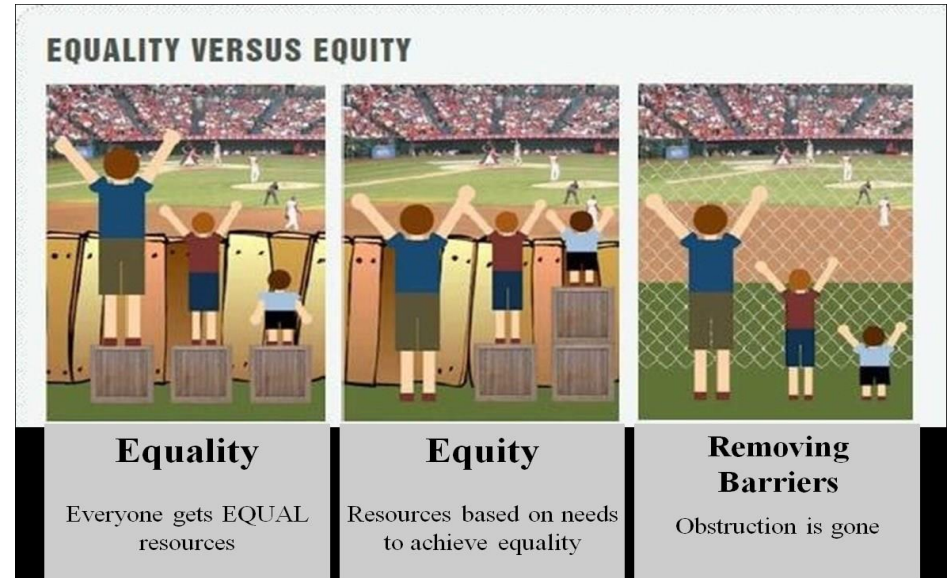

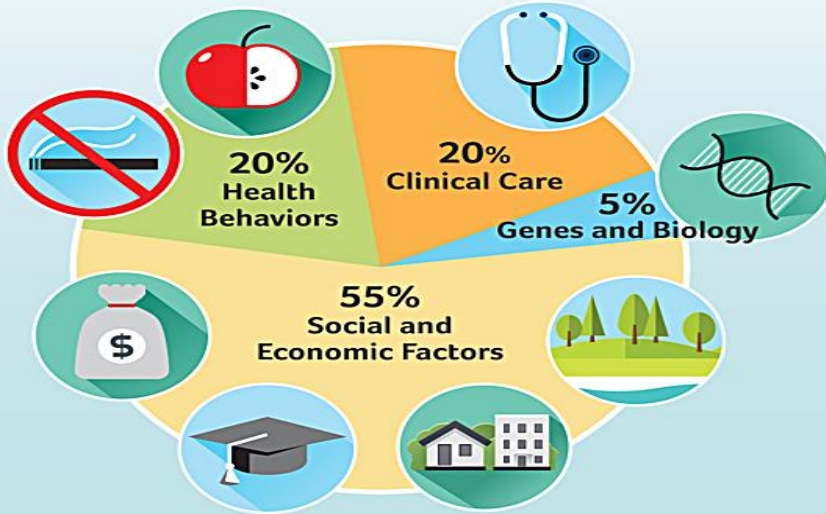

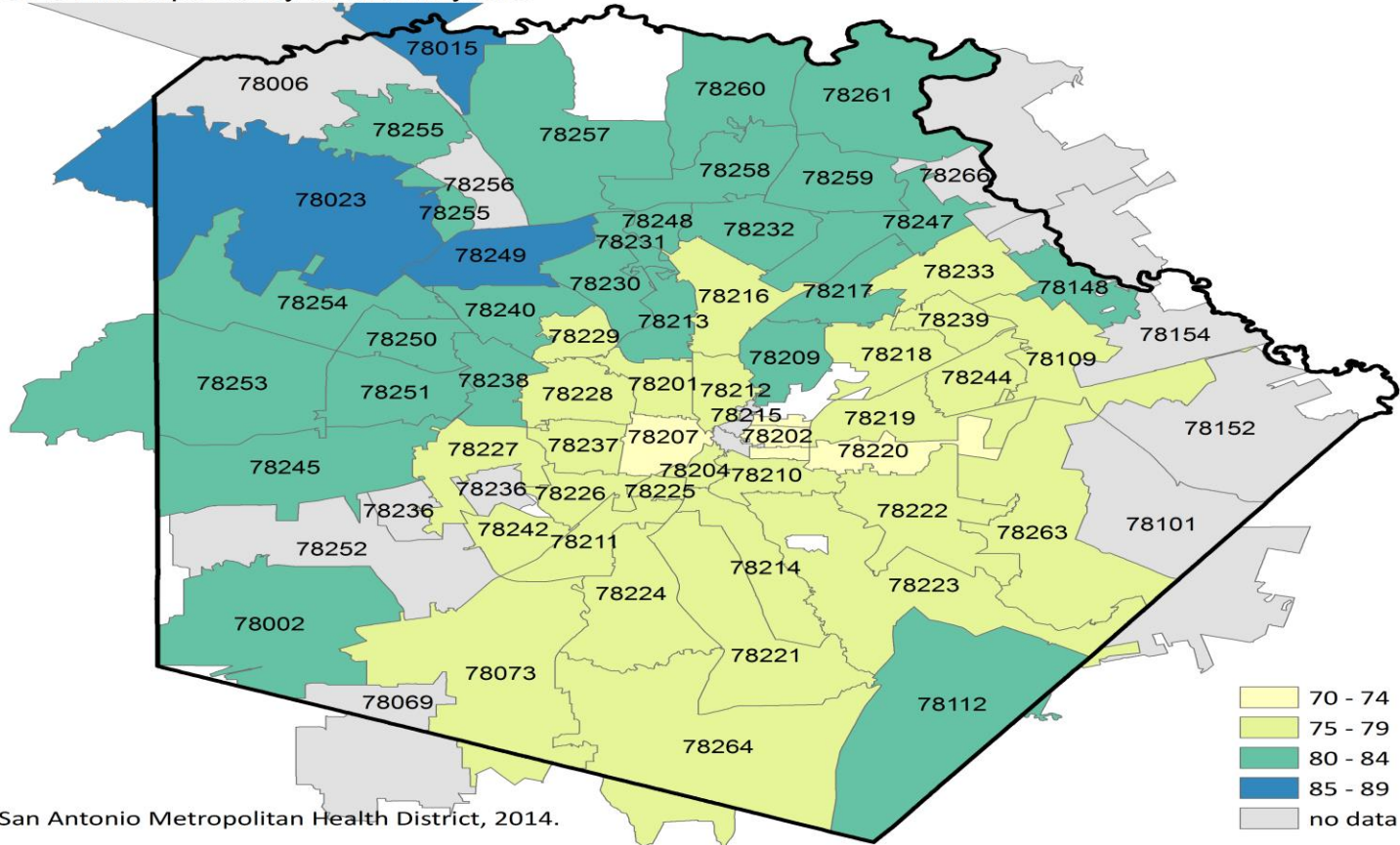
Determinants of Health

Figure 5.25 Life expectancy at birth in years



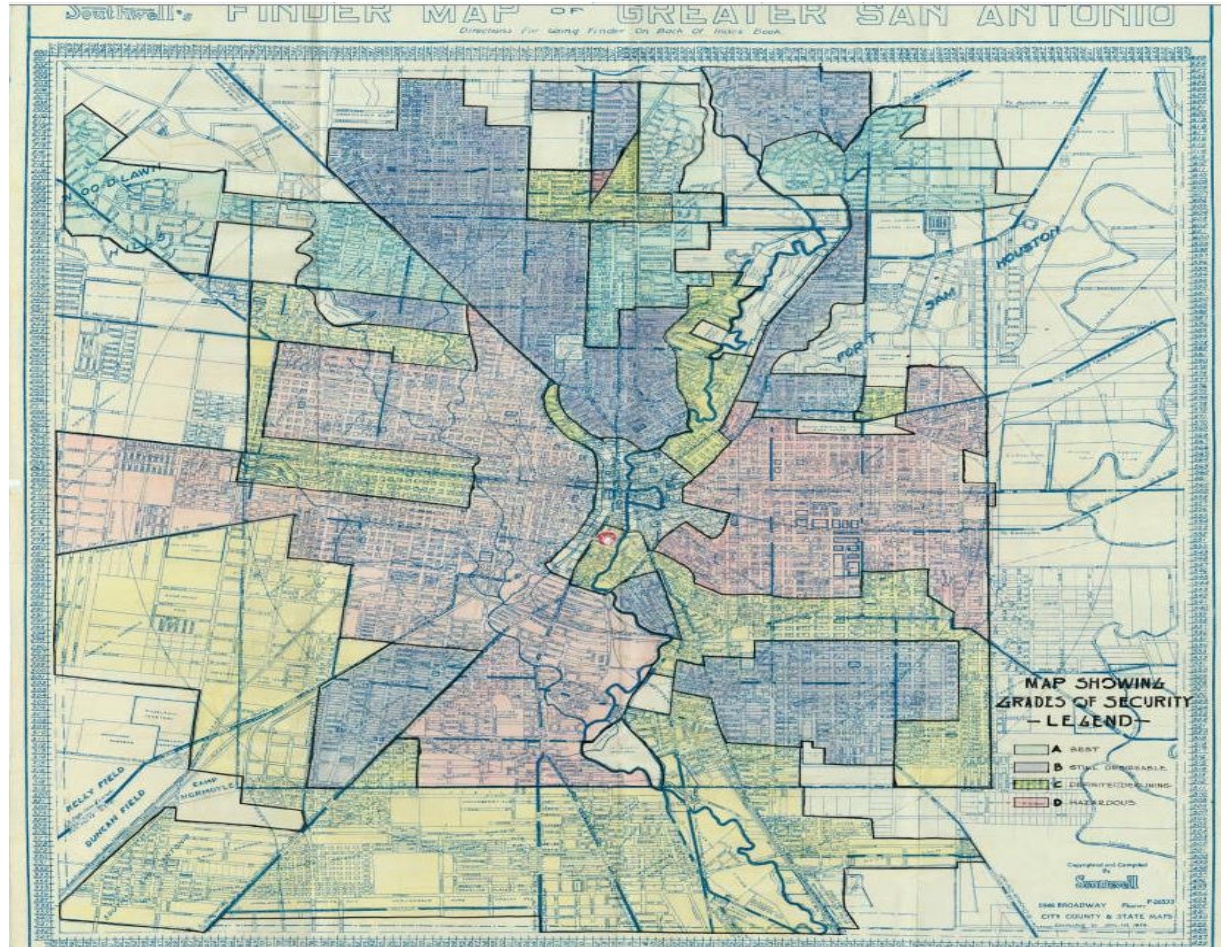

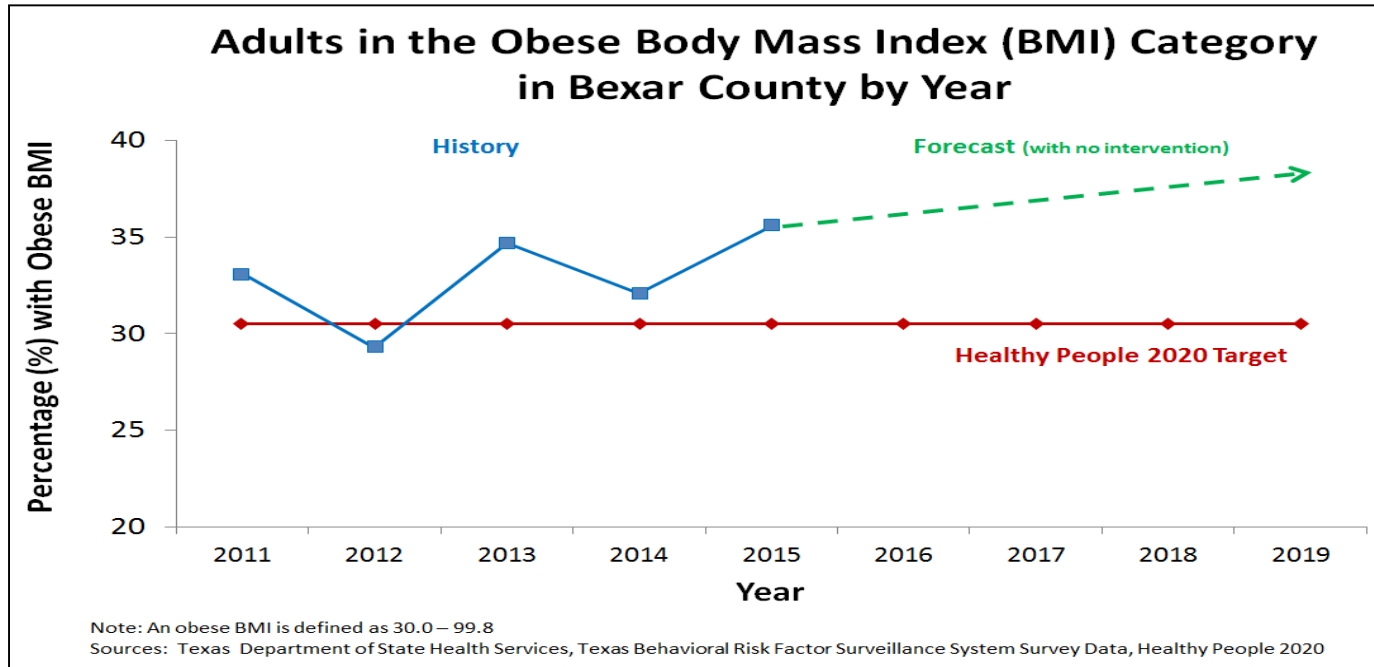

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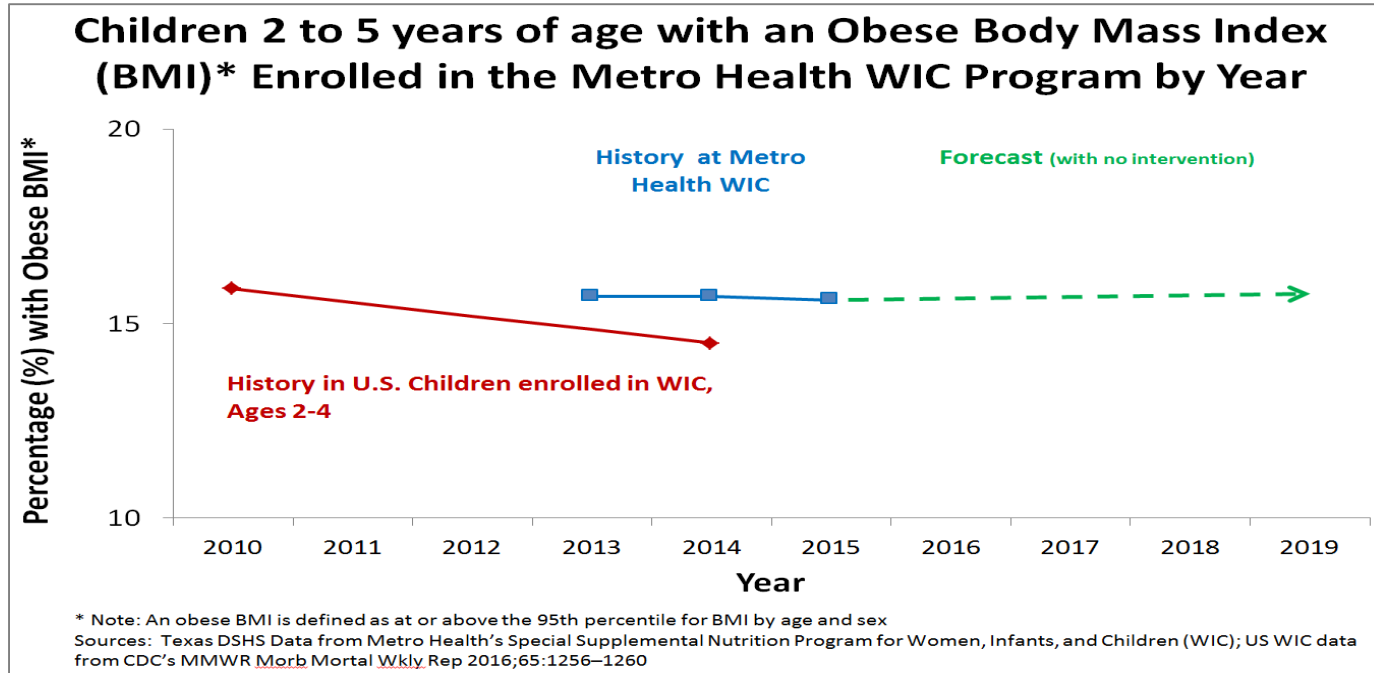

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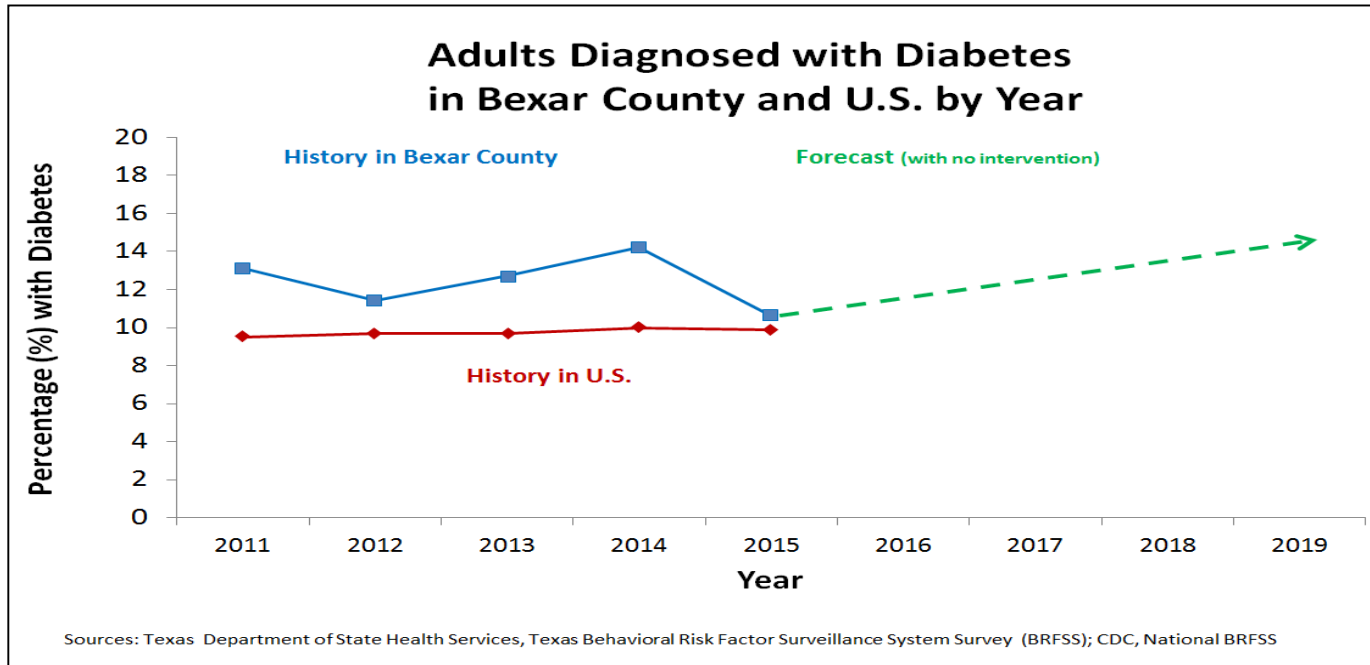
Obesity in Children





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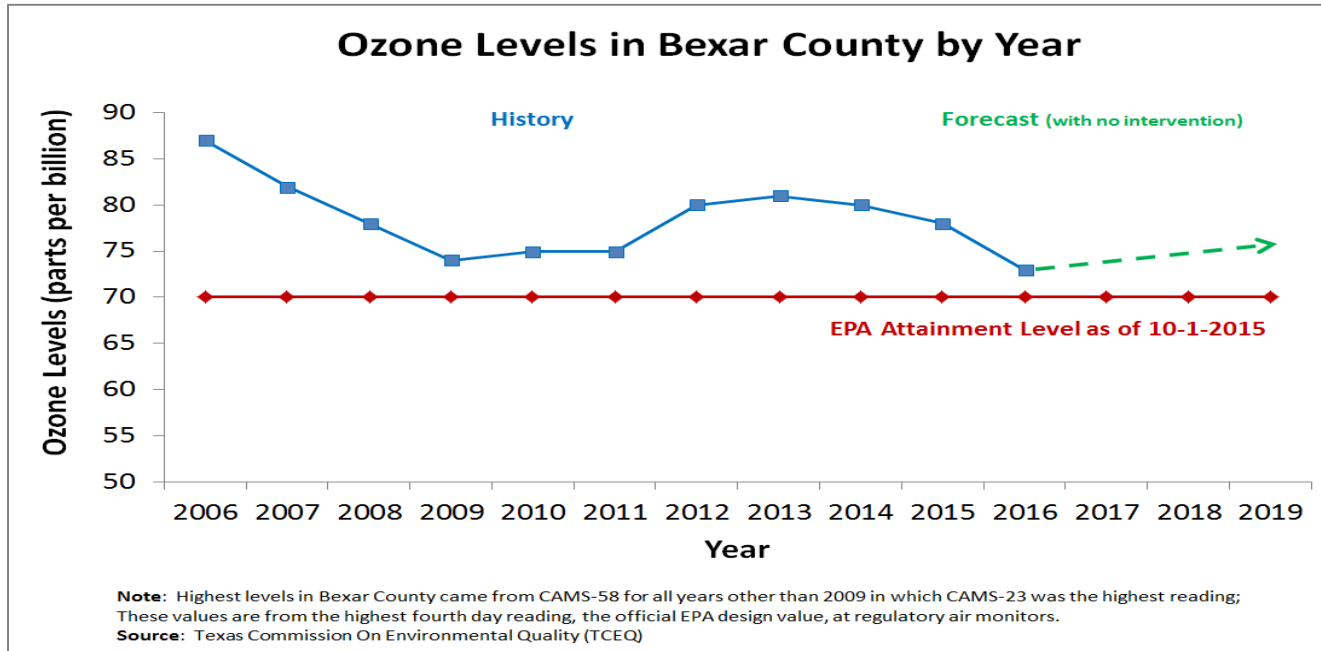
Type 2 Diabetes

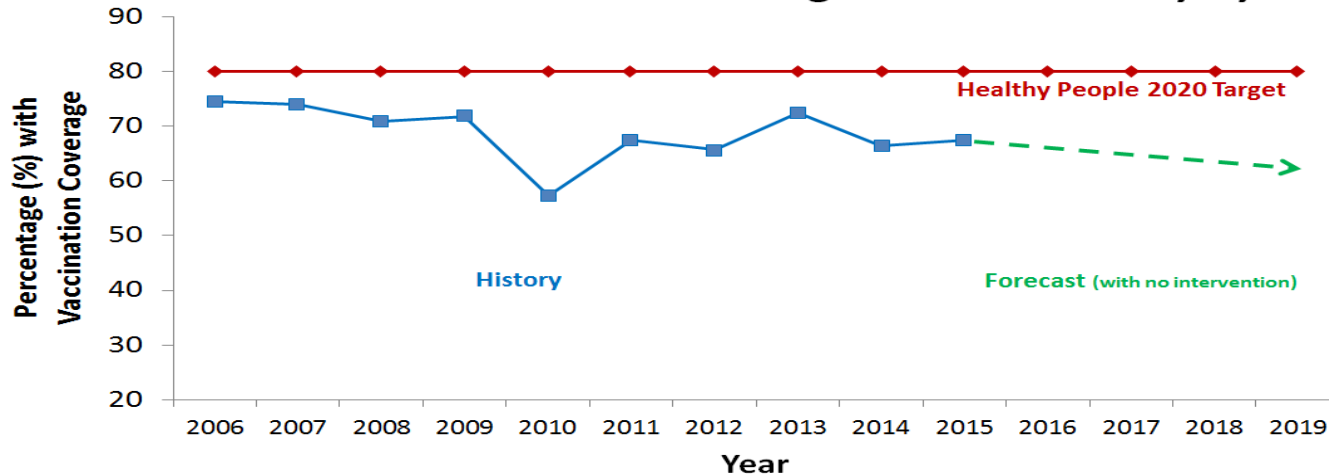




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Immunizations in Children
