AN ORDINANCE

ACCEPTING THE LOWEST REPSONSIVE BID AND AWARDING A 2017-2018 TASK ORDER CONTRACT FOR STORM WATER PROJECTS TO PRONTO SANDBLASTING & COATING & OIL FIELD SERVICES CO., INC., FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STORM WATER PROJECTS CITYWIDE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$3,799,726.00.

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WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio uses task order contracts for small construction projects to allow for quick execution of work and are advertised with an estimated quantity of work; and

WHEREAS, TCI will utilize the task order contract on an as-needed basis in order to expedite delivery and completion of various storm water related projects located throughout the city. Such work may entail construction of a storm sewer, culvert, inlet, drainage channel, detention pond, and/or an outfall structure; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance accepts the lowest responsive bid submitted by **Pronto Sandblasting & Coating & Oil Field Services Co., Inc.**, for the construction of storm water projects, citywide, in a total amount not to exceed \$3,799,726.00; and

WHEREAS, this Task Order Contract will be awarded in compliance with the Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Program, which requires contracts to be reviewed by a Goal Setting Committee to establish a requirement and/or incentive unique to the particular contract in an effort to maximize the amount of small, minority, and women-owned business participation on the contract; and

WHEREAS, projects will be funded through various funding sources which may include, but are not limited to Storm Water Revenue Bonds, Storm Water Operating Fund and the Storm Water Regional Facilities Fund. The City makes no minimum guarantee pertaining to the volume of work; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The lowest responsive bid of **Pronto Sandblasting & Coating & Oil Field Services Co., Inc.**, in the total amount not to exceed \$3,799,726.00 for the construction of storm water projects located citywide is hereby approved. All other bids will be considered rejected upon the execution of a contract by the successful bidder and the deposit of all required bonds and insurance certificates or the expiration of ninety (90) days from the effective date hereof, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 2. A Task Order Contract is hereby awarded to **Pronto Sandblasting & Coating & Oil Field Services Co., Inc.**

SECTION 3. The following financial adjustment is hereby approved:

- a) Funding for this ordinance will be identified when work orders are issued. If funding for any work orders is not previously appropriated, funding will be identified and appropriated through subsequent City Council action. Payment is limited to the amounts budgeted in the Operating and/or Capital Budget funding sources identified. All expenditures will comply with Operating and/or Capital Budgets for current and future fiscal years.
- b) Payment not to exceed \$3,799,726.00 per year, is authorized to be encumbered with a purchase order and made payable to **Pronto Sandblasting & Coating & Oil Field Services Co., Inc.**, for on-call construction of storm water projects, citywide.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP fund numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by eight or more affirmative votes; otherwise, it shall be effective on the tenth day after passage.
