**Item 2. Update on the proposed legislation from the 85th State Legislative Session [Jeff Coyle, Director, Government & Public Affairs]**

Chairperson Krier acknowledged staff for their time and efforts in reporting information back to the Committee.

Jeff Coyle provided an update on the 85th State Legislative Session. He reported that all Revenue Cap Bills, Annexation Bills, and the Bathroom Bills had been defeated. He stated that Budget SB1 passed; funding the Alamo at \$87.5 million and DEAAAG with \$20 million. He noted that Tree Mitigation-SB 744, Transportation Network Companies (TNC)-HB 100, and the Statewide Texting while Driving-HB 62 were passed. He added that there were other bills that affected local control that were defeated. He mentioned that there were other bills that the City supported but did not directly affect the City.

Councilmember Viagran thanked everyone that was engaged in the process and recognized staff for their commitment. She stated that she was pleased with staff reports for the 85<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session.

Councilmember Nirenberg asked why the military compromise was removed from the Annexation Bill. Mr. Coyle responded that there were developers that were against the City being able to extend land use regulations to the extraterritorial jurisdiction.

No action was required for Item 2.

Item 1 was addressed at this time.

**Item 1. Approval of minutes from the March 8 and March 29 Intergovernmental Relations Council Subcommittee Meetings.**
