## AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT IN AN AMOUNT OF \$208,715.00 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TECHNOLOGY RELATED TO, AND TO PARTICIPATE IN, THE NATIONAL INTEGRATED BALLISTIC INFORMATION NETWORK.

**WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2017, the San Antonio Police Department submitted a Special Category Grant Opportunity Submission Authorization Request to apply for a U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice programs, Technology Innovation for Public Safety grant for the implementation of technology related to, and to participate in, the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN); and

**WHEREAS**, To use NIBIN, firearms examiners or technicians enter gun cartridge casing images from crime scenes and other sources into the Integrated Ballistic Identification System, which is then used by NIBIN to compare against similar evidence entered by SAPD, and other jurisdictions across the country; and

**WHEREAS**, the NIBIN program automates ballistics evaluations and provides actionable investigative leads in a timely manner to assist in the investigation of cases involving firearms; and

**WHEREAS**, SAPD was notified on September 26, 2017, that it had been awarded \$218,715.00 for the program which will allow for the purchase and installation of one complete NIBIN system/station; and

WHEREAS, no cash match is required by the city; NOW THEREFORE:

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

**SECTION 1.** The City Manager or her designee, or the San Antonio Chief of Police or his designee, is hereby authorized to accept grant funds upon award in an amount up to \$208,715.00 from the DOJ, Office of Justice Program, for the implementation of technology related to, and to participate in, NIBIN for the period beginning October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018. A copy of said application is on file with the San Antonio Police Department.

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**SECTION 2.** The City Manager or her designee, or the San Antonio Chief of Police or his designee, is hereby is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said acceptance.

**SECTION 3.** Upon acceptance of this award, a new fund and internal order number will be created, upon which the sum of up to \$208,715.00 from the DOJ will be appropriated in said fund. The proposed budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Exhibit I**, is approved and adopted for entry in the City books.

**SECTION 4.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5.** This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective on the tenth day after passage.
