

Partnership Background

- In 2009, a Corporate Recruiting and Retention Committee provided recommendations to address the long-term strategic planning for the San Antonio region.
- FY 2011-2015 public/private partnership between the City and SAEDF, with the annual adoption of an Action Plan with implementation metrics:
 - Recruitment. Focus on core industries, targeted areas and emerging business sectors.
 - Retention. Implementation of a Business Retention and Expansion program (BRE).
 - Marketing. Creation of a collaborative and enhanced marketing plan.
 - Strategic Plan. Development of a comprehensive strategic plan for economic development.
- On January 5, 2016 the partnership was assessed and potential opportunities for enhancement.
 - Agreed upon job creation goals met and Strategic Plan complete
 - Strategic and tactical alignment needing improvement
 - Need additional private sector leadership and enhanced resource utilization.

SAEDF FY 2018 Agreement


- In FY 2018, SAEDF has enhanced:
 - SAEDF aligned to Targeted Industries and functional areas of recruitment, retention/expansion, entrepreneurial development, and workforce development.
 - Convening of economic development stakeholders and developing and executing tactics in collaboration with industry through the integration of workgroups.
- In FY 2018 SAEDF will continue to:
 - Provide economic development services with associated metrics.
 - Implement the San Antonio Trade and Investment Strategy.
 - Administer the agreement with the City's Texas/Japan Office.

SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan

- Jobs and Economic Competitiveness section of the SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan (25-year plan) guides economic development policy focused on geography, and targeted industry recruitment, retention/expansion, entrepreneurial development and workforce development.
- Forefront SA (5-year plan) strategic framework was developed in 2015 and outlines the overall economic development system. Renewed every five years (ending in 2020) and developed in congruence with SA Tomorrow.
- City Council annually adopts a \$500k economic development services agreement (1-year Action Plan) with SAEDF towards annual fulfilment of the Forefront SA plan.
