Background - Taxicab Permits

- 886 Taxi Permits
- Set by a formula:
 - 1 cab per 1700 population
- Current code requires a cab operator to have at least three permits
- November 2016 petition submitted by 200 drivers

Direction from City Council (December 2016)

- Meet and attempt to address request for single owner/operator permits
- Same standards
- Other Cities:
 - -San Diego
 - Houston
 - Dallas
 - Minneapolis



Issues

- Taxi industry has undergone major changes since the arrival of TNCs
- Individuals want the opportunity to work for themselves
- Not an issue of too many taxis
- Supply and demand
- Policy discussion: What is the City's role in determining who can drive a taxi?

Alternatives



- 1) Change code to allow for owner/operator permits
- 2) A. Remove the formula from City Code
 - B. Work with current companies to identify permits not being used.

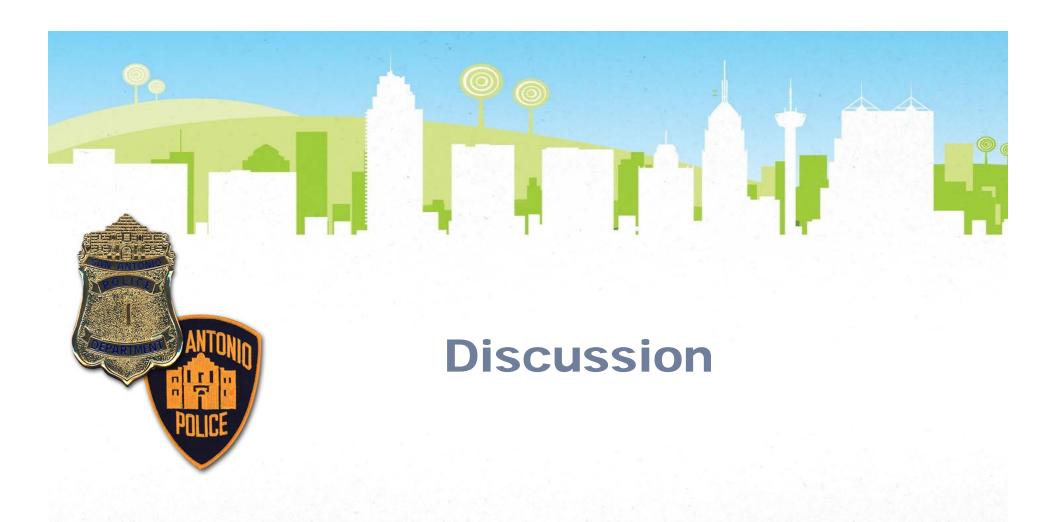
Recommendations
