A request for a change in zoning from "R-6 MLOD ERZD" Residential Single-Family Camp Bullis Military Lighting Overlay Edwards Recharge Zone District to "MF-33 MLOD ERZD" Multi-Family Camp Bullis Military Lighting Overlay Edwards Recharge Zone District on 9.02 acres out of NCB 14865, located at 14715 Babcock Road.
