RATIFYING THE SUBMISSION OF **GRANT** AUTHORIZING APPLICATION TO AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS FROM THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE DIVISION FOR THE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$138.870.00 BEGINNING **OCTOBER** 2018 **FOR** THE SAN **ANTONIO** METROPOLITAN HEALTH DISTRICT'S STAND UP SA PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (Metro Health) has been implementing Stand UP SA, Texas' first evidence-based Cure Violence program since 2014; and

WHEREAS, the nationally recognized Cure Violence community-based violence prevention program uses epidemic control to reduce violence; and

WHEREAS, the Cure Violence Model process includes training staff members to anticipate where violence may occur and intervene before it erupts; and

WHEREAS, the Cure Violence Model also supports engaging the entire community to change behaviors and norms; and

WHEREAS, the goals of Metro Health's Stand Up SA program includes establishing meaningful, collaborative, and sustainable partnerships within targeted neighborhoods and educating the public regarding methodology to reduce gun violence; and

WHEREAS, Metro Health requests City Council ratify the Department's submission of a grant application to and authorize the acceptance of funds, if awarded, from the Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division for the Justice Assistance Grant Program; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The submission of a grant application to the Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division for the Justice Assistance Grant Program is ratified. A copy of said grant application which is incorporated herein for all purposes is on file with the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.

SECTION 2. The City Manager or her designee or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District or her designee is authorized to accept funds from the Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division for the Justice Assistance Grant Program in an amount not to exceed \$138,870.00 for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's Stand UP SA program beginning October 1, 2018 and is further authorized to initiate, negotiate, and execute any and all necessary documents and a grant contract to effectuate the acceptance of the referenced grant, and to execute

pertaining to this contract, to include a) carry-over funds, when ascertained and approved by the funding agency through a revised notice of award; b) line item budget revisions authorized by the funding agency; c) modifications to the performance measures authorized by the funding agency and listed in the contract so long as the terms of the amendment stay within the general parameters of the intent of the grant; d) no cost extensions; e) amendments which will provide supplemental grant funds to a grant by the funding agency in an amount up to 10% of the total amount initially awarded to the grant; f) reimbursement increases of administrative funds for each participant served; g) amendments funding one time equipment purchases or defined program services; and h) changes in regulations mandated by the funding agency.

SECTION 3. The City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of San Antonio to accept said grant. The City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Criminal Justice Division funds, the City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the Criminal Justice Division in full. The City Council designates the Assistant to the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

SECTION 4. Should funding be awarded, upon acceptance of this award, new funds and internal order numbers will be created, upon which the award amount will be appropriated from the Office of the Governor. The proposed budget attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I** is approved. A formal final budget which will include SAP Internal Order numbers and SAP GL Accounts will be submitted by the department upon award.

SECTION 5. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Resolution is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.

- Violence is a significant public health problem
 - Affecting individuals, families, schools, and communities
- There is strong evidence that violence can be prevented and its impact reduced, similar to what has been done for:
 - Traumatic injuries, infectious diseases, and pregnancy complications





Background

- Violence Interruption Initiative
 - Establishes partnerships within targeted neighborhoods



- Educates the public to reduce gun violence
- Ultimate goals:
 - Interrupt the cycle of violence, reduce risk, and influence community norms on violence
- Grant funds will be used to
 - Hire temporary staff member for data analysis
 - Purchase equipment
 - Bring awareness through a media campaign



Fiscal Impact

- The Justice Assistance Grant Program has funds for applicants in the Alamo Area Council Of Governments region
- Metro Health's application was for \$138,870.00
- Funding term: October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019
- There is no impact to the General Fund



Recommendation
