AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION, AND ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS UPON AWARD, FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR \$1,228,141.00 TO FUND THE 2018 SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM OPERATED BY THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE 11, 2018, THROUGH AUGUST 17, 2018.

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WHEREAS, this application will allow the continuation of the Summer Food Service Program that has provided nutritional meals to children age eighteen and below in our community during the summer months since 1969; and

WHEREAS, the program will enable service to over 6,610 children, with maximum capacity to serve approximately 258,315 lunches and 254,605 snacks throughout the summer in conjunction with the SAPAR's Summer Youth Programs and other city-wide non-profit organizations at over 68 sites such as, YWCA, La Promesa, St. John Bosco, and various university PREP courses; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Department provides these services through Selrico Services, Inc., an outside contractor selected through a competitive process in January 2015 and is in the fourth year of a five year agreement; and

WHEREAS, Parks and Recreation staff coordinated with Metro Health to ensure a Por Vida designated healthy menu again this year; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, this ordinance allows the establishment of a fund, budget and 12 temporary employee positions to coordinate the food program; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget for the Summer Food Service Program is outlined in Attachment I; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance will also allow the City to accept any additional Texas Department of Agriculture funds for food service awarded during the term of this grant; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager, or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee is hereby authorized to submit a grant application and accept funds upon award, from the Texas Department of Agriculture for \$1,228,141.00 to fund the 2018 Summer Food Service Program operated by the Parks and Recreation Department for the period of June 11, 2018, through August 17, 2018. A copy of said application is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I.**

SECTION 2. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is further authorized to accept any additional grant funds if awarded from the Texas Department of Agriculture for the 2018 Summer Food Services Program up to 10% of the original award, and to execute any and all necessary documents to accept said additional funding.

SECTION 3. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said application and acceptance.

SECTION 4. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is hereby authorized to carry-over funds, in an amount up to \$24,036.00 for a total program budget of \$1,252,177.00.

SECTION 5. Should funding be awarded, upon acceptance of this award a new fund and internal order will be created. The sum of \$1,228,141.00 from the Texas Department of Agriculture and the carry-over funds in the amount of \$24,036.00 will be appropriated in said fund. The budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment II**, is approved and adopted for entry in the City books.

SECTION 6. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. This ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
