- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) established Meaningful Use Standards
  - Mandates Electronic Health Records (EHR)
  - Enhances data accessibility for Providers and Patients
  - Requires safeguards to ensure confidentiality of health information
- Metro Health currently uses an EHR
  - Current system was implemented in 2009
  - System is near end of life and requires replacement







- Request for Competitive Sealed Proposals (RFCSP) issued May 25, 2017
- Selected vendor: Custom Data Processing, Inc. (CDP) ezEMRx System
- The EHR (ezEMRx) system will:
  - Improve access to information for providers and patients
  - Integrate with State partners for reporting requirements
  - Meet Meaningful Use requirements
  - Provide for electronic billing





Initial Contract begins upon City Council approval through September 30, 2019

• With four (4), one-year renewal options
