## 2018 URBAN AREA SECURITY INITATIVE (UASI) Homeland Security Grant Program

- UASI Program created In 2003 in response to 9/11 terrorist attack. The San Antonio Urban Area (MSA) received \$42,454,100 between 2004 and 2010. San Antonio was awarded 67% of these funds (\$28,312,788)
- Lost UASI funding in 2011, 2013, 2015, and 2016
- Awarded \$1.2M in 2012, \$1M in 2014, and \$1M in 2017.
- Changes in the 2018 DHS Risk Assessment Process increased the award from \$1M to 1.5M.

## 2018 URBAN AREA SECURITY INITATIVE (UASI) 2018 ACCOMPLISHENTS

- Meeting with FEMA Administrator Brock Long regarding UASI funding
- Meeting in Austin with Tom DiNanno, FEMA Assistant Grants Administrator to request changes to risk assessment process and more funding
- Meeting with DHS leadership during the 2018 SA-DC trip to discuss changes to the risk assessment process
- Visit from Bridget Bean, FEMA Deputy Assistant Grants Administrator, during the 2018 Fiesta events to tour the City's homeland security operations
- DHS added changes to the FY18 risk assessment process that resulted in an additional UASI award of \$500,000

Sustainment of the Southwest Texas Fusion Center



- Equipment and Specialized Training for SAPD Bomb Squad, Helicopter Unit, SWAT, Tactical Medical Unit and Negotiator Unit
- Equipment and Specialized Training for SAFD Hazmat Teams, Technical Rescue Teams, and Medical Support Unit
- Sustainment Office of Emergency Management Staffing and Strategic Planning
