# **Background**



- UHS provides medical screenings to arrestees brought to the Central Magistration & Detention Center (CMAG)
  - The City of San Antonio and Bexar County jointly operate the CMAG
  - ILA requires COSA to reimburse Bexar County for portion of the contract
  - On July 1, 2018 Bexar County announced it will open the Justice Intake and Assessment Center (JIAC) to process all arrestees.

### **Arrestee Administrative Processing Center**



- The SAPD will continue to operate the CMAG, which will transition to Arrestee Administrative Processing Center (AAPC), to maintain operational efficiencies
  - JIAC does not provide for public inebriate or Class C arrestee processing
  - Intake/Processing area is under designed for arrestee volume
  - JIAC inefficiencies will result in considerable delays for officers
- Proposed contract with UHS will maintain current level of medical services at the AAPC upon Bexar County vacating the facility

# **Proposed Contract**



- Two year contract, with a two-year renewal option, to maintain on-site healthcare services at the AAPC.
  - Contract execution upon Bexar County vacating the facility
  - Amount not to exceed \$749,341.46 for first two years
  - Renewal by mutual agreement between City and UHS

### Recommendation



 City Council approval of two year contract, with a two-year renewal option, with UHS to maintain onsite healthcare services to arrestees at the AAPC.
