A RESOLUTION 2018 - 11 - 15 - 0050R

SUPPORTING WOMEN'S SAFETY, HEALTH, AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

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WHEREAS, in the City of San Antonio over 51% (591,401) of the total population of 1,144,646 is women; and

WHEREAS, women have and continue to make their mark in San Antonio and move the City forward in all fields; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio recognizes the fundamental and indispensable contributions of women to the prosperity of the City as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the need to remain proactive in addressing health, safety, and equitable opportunities and outcomes for all women and girls; and

WHEREAS, San Antonians from across the City created shared community goals as reflected in the SA2020 community vision, including goals for reducing domestic violence, improving women's health outcomes, and enhancing economic entrepreneurship; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence, which disproportionately affects women, is trending upwards in San Antonio despite the community's shared goals, which are reflected in the SA2020 community vision to reduce domestic violence rates by half; and

WHEREAS, while the San Antonio community has worked together through largely women-led initiatives to reduce the teen birth rate in the City, the teen birth rate remains above the national average, and maternal and child health in San Antonio is worsening and falling short of SA2020 goals, particularly for families where social determinants negatively impact health outcomes; and

WHEREAS, though there is an increasing number of successful female entrepreneurs in San Antonio who improve the City through creating business and employment opportunities and who serve as role models for current and future generations, San Antonio women, on average, earn less money, own and operate fewer businesses, and have less access to capital investments than their male counterparts; and

WHEREAS, women have historically been, and remain, underrepresented on appointed boards and commissions and in elected office positions, yet more women are running for office and seeking public service roles in San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, with the purpose of asserting on a global stage that San Antonio is a city that recognizes the contributions and leadership of women that move City forward, and which promotes equity for women and girls, and prevents the perpetration of violence against them in any form; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City of San Antonio is committed to eliminating all forms of violence against women and girls, to promoting the health and safety of women and girls, and to promoting substantive economic, business, and leadership opportunities for women in San Antonio.

SECTION 2. The City Council of the City of San Antonio acknowledges that this resolution is the first step toward comprehensive strategies to address priorities in the areas of domestic violence and sexual assault, women's health outcomes, and inequitable access to economic and business opportunities.

SECTION 3. The City Council of the City of San Antonio will encourage and take action to support strategies, including accountability measures, to address priorities in the areas of domestic violence and sexual assault, women's health outcomes, and equitable access to economic and business opportunities. Further, the strategies and accountability measures will disaggregate data in order to design the most effective strategies and action.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes, or, in the event eight affirmative votes are not received, ten days after approval.





- ✓ Increase the number of successful women entrepreneurs and highly skilled women in the workforce.






