**AN ORDINANCE**

**AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION  
IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$88,058.88 FROM THE  
SOUTHWEST TEXAS REGIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL  
FOR TRAUMA FOR USE BY THE MOBILE  
INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE UNIT OF THE  
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DIVISION OF THE  
SAN ANTONIO FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR ELIGIBLE  
EXPENSES INCLUDING SALARIES AND BENEFITS,  
PROCUREMENT OF SUPPLIES, AND EDUCATION  
AND TRAINING; AND APPROVING A PROGRAM  
BUDGET.**

**WHEREAS**, the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC) has informed the San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) of its intention to donate funds in an amount up to \$88,858.88 to be used by the Mobile Integrated Healthcare (MIH) Unit of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Division of SAFD for eligible expenses including salaries and benefits, education, and training; and

**WHEREAS**, among the uses to which the donated funds will be put by the MIH program is the utilization of two (2) MIH paramedics to connect with individuals, identified by SAFD personnel while providing EMS services, as being at high risk for opioid overdose, for the purpose of engaging and inducting these individuals into recovery support services; and

**WHEREAS**, it is anticipated that the above described program will ultimately be working with approximately 300 opioid patients;

**WHEREAS**, no cash or in-kind matching contributions are required; **NOW THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1.** The donation to the City in an amount up to \$88,858.88 from STRAC, to be used by the Mobile Integrated Healthcare (MIH) Unit of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Division of SAFD for eligible expenses including salaries and benefits, procurement of supplies, and education and training, including utilization of two (2) MIH paramedics to connect with individuals, identified by SAFD personnel while providing EMS services, as being at high risk for opioid overdose, for the purpose of inducting and engaging these individuals into recovery support services for the period of December 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019, is hereby accepted.

**SECTION 2.** A copy of a letter from STRAC to SAFD regarding this donation and setting forth certain specifics regarding the use of the donated funds is attached hereto as **Attachment 1** and made a part hereof for all purposes. The City Manager or her designee, or the Fire Chief or his designee, are each hereby authorized to execute any and all additional documents necessary to effectuate and evidence the acceptance of the donation and/or perform the programs for which the funds will be used, without further action by the City Council.

**SECTION 4.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer (“DCFO”), City of San Antonio. The DCFO may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5.** This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
