RECOMMENDATION

TCI requests adopting amendments to Chapter 34 on behalf of SAWS

- Required to meet new Federal and State requirements
 - Reduce discharge of mercury from dental amalgam
 - EPA ruling June 2017
 - TCEQ adoption July 2018
- Streamline and modify program processes
- Clarify existing wording for regulatory purposes

Pretreatment Program (Ch. 34, Article V, Division 3)

- Add new EPA-mandated regulation for Dental offices
 - Disposal of dental amalgam (mercury)
- Require dental offices to register with SAWS and meet state and federal regulations
- Update verbiage to bring consistency throughout the code to define SAWS as the Control Authority



Storm Water (Ch. 34, Article VI, Division 5)

- Amend for clarification of references for registered/certified professionals for the Construction Storm Water Program
- Update the prohibited discharge listing to protect the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)
 - Any soil, soil material, sediment, rock, gravel, etc. that would reduce the capacity or to cause an obstruction of the MS4
 - Any paint, medical waste, automotive fluids, etc.



Fire Hydrant Meter Program (Ch. 34, Article II, Division 6)

 Change the required frequency for the re-calibration of hydrant meters from every 6 months to every 12 months

Backflow Prevention Program (Ch. 34, Article VI, Division 8)

- Establish standardized date to submit annual test reports
- Promote use on online test submittal process
 - Potential to waive submittal fees if submitted online



Fats, Oils and Grease Program (Ch. 34, Article V, Division 4)

 Update verbiage to bring consistency throughout code to define SAWS as the Control Authority



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
