APPROVING A CAPACITY BASED AUTHORIZATION FOR THE CITY TO UTILIZE THE MINNESOTA MULTISTATE CONTRACTING ALLIANCE FOR PHARMACY CONTRACT TO PROVIDE THE CITY WITH VACCINES AND BIOLOGICALS FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000.00 OVER A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS. FUNDED THROUGH THE GENERAL FUND AND STATE AND FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS.

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WHEREAS, the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (Metro Health) historically used contracts available through the Texas SmartBuy Program and managed by the Texas Statewide Procurement Division to purchase vaccines and biologicals; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Statewide Procurement Division ended direct contracting with multiple vaccine and biologicals manufacturers and joined the Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP) contract as a Statewide Agency; and

WHEREAS, the MMCAP program is operated by the State of Minnesota's Department of Administration and provides vaccines, biologicals, healthcare products and services from multiple manufacturers at discount pricing equal to or greater than the pricing previously realized through the Texas Statewide Procurement Division; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas's MMCAP Membership, through the Texas Statewide Procurement Division, provides access to competitively bid vaccines and biological products under MMCAP terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code section 271.102 provides for the City's participation in cooperative purchasing programs and such purchases satisfy any state law requiring competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance will authorize the City to utilize the MMCAP contract to provide the City with vaccines and biologicals in an amount up to \$500,000.00 over a five year period; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City is hereby authorized to utilize the Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy contract to provide the City with vaccines and biologicals in an amount up to \$500,000.00 over a five year period.

SECTION 2. Funding for this ordinance in the amount of \$80,000.00 is available in Fund 11001000, Cost Center 3616010002 and General Ledger 5304040 as part of the Fiscal Year 2019 budget. Additional funding in the amount of \$420,000.00 is contingent upon City Council approval in subsequent years.

SECTION 3. Payment not to exceed the budgeted amount is authorized to the Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP) contract to provide the City with vaccines and biologicals. All expenditures will be in accordance with the Fiscal Year 2019 and subsequent budgets that fall within the term of this contract approved by City Council.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. This ordinance is effective immediately upon passage by eight affirmative votes; otherwise it is effective on the tenth day after passage.
