ANNUAL ADOPTION OF SELF MONITORING STANDARDS INCLUDE:

- Minimum Staffing Ratios
- Minimum Staff Qualifications
- Minimum Facility Health & Safety Standards
- Monitoring and Enforcement Mechanisms



SELF-MONITORING STANDARDS



- ✓ *Requires annual adoption by City Council*
- ✓ *Operated under self-monitoring standards since 2003*

2019 SELF-MONITORING STANDARDS CHANGES

State no longer requires Standards and Ordinance

Area Code added for 10-digit phone numbers

Electronic Copies of Standards; Printed upon request

Emergency exits to fenced areas should have unlocked gate where applicable/allowable
