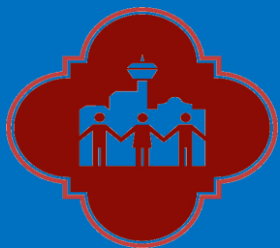

198 Total Responses

- 19 Non- EHS-CCP families

- Center activities ranked third (31)
- Other category ranked fourth (20)

Of 180 respondents...

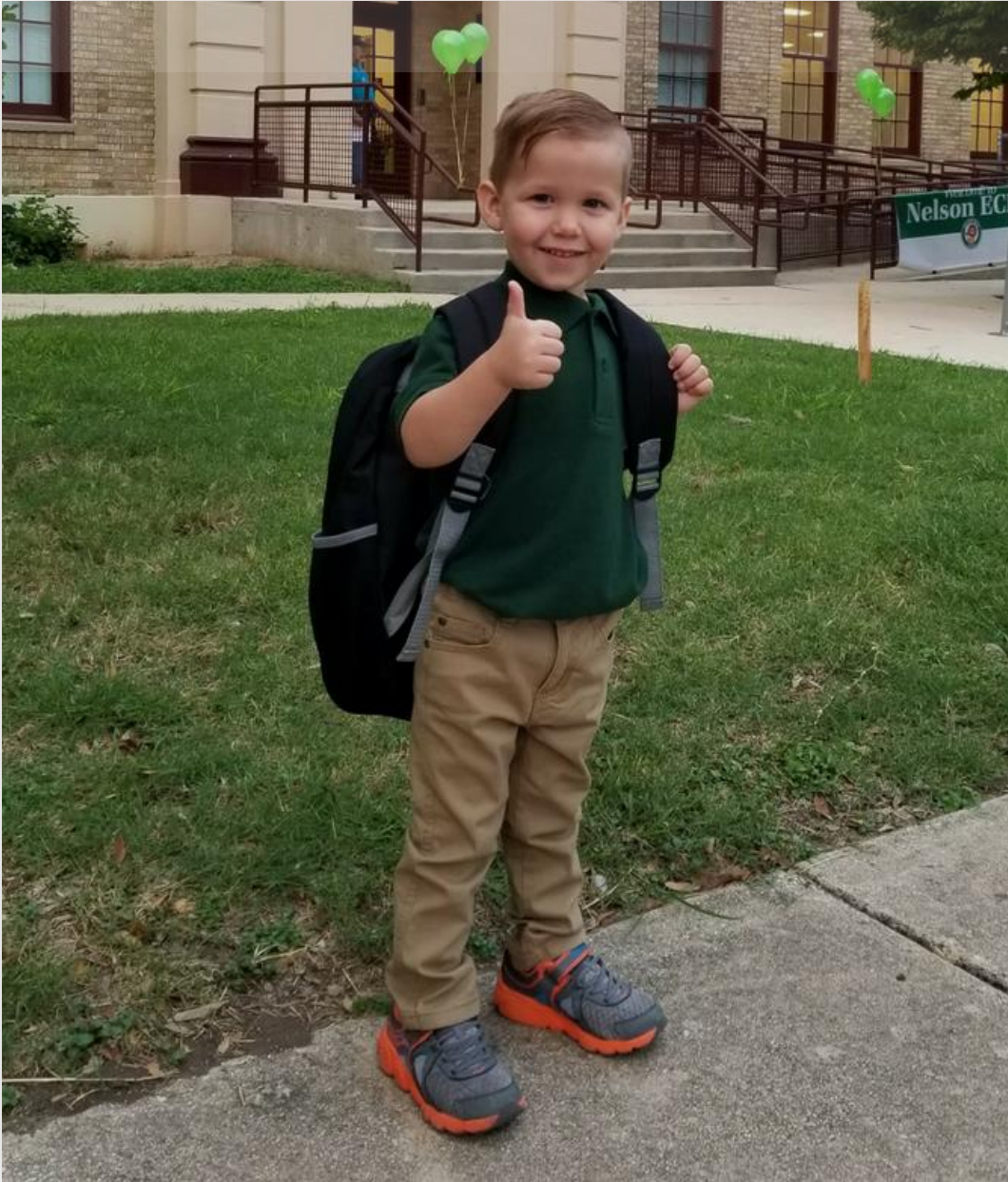
- 97 said YES, they'd be willing to volunteer

HEALTH SERVICES

Requirements

- A program must provide high-quality health, oral health, mental health, and nutrition services that are developmentally, culturally, and linguistically appropriate and that will support each child's growth and school readiness. (HSPPS 1302.40)
- Programs must collaborate with parents as partners in the health and well-being of their children in a linguistically and culturally appropriate manner and communicate with parents about their child's health needs and development concerns in a timely and effective manner (HSPPS 1302.41)
