AN ORDINANCE 2019-05-02-0355

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION FOR AN AWARD OF UP TO \$1,000,000.00 FROM THE 2019 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF AWARDED FUNDS AND; APPROVING A PERSONNEL COMPLEMENT OF TWO (2) POSITIONS.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the Office of the Governor, Homeland Security Grants Division (HSGD) has grant funds available from the 2019 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP), a program that is designed to enhance the State's ability to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of international terrorism; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Office of Emergency Management (SAOEM) wishes to apply for grant funds in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 to accomplish that purpose; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance also approves a total personnel complement of two (2) positions to be funded for a period of one year upon award; and

WHEREAS, the grant period would be October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, an award of this grant would not require a cash matching or in-kind contribution; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee, or the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) or designee, is hereby authorized to submit a grant application and accept grant funds upon award in an amount up to \$1,000,000.00 from the Office of the Governor, Homeland Security Grants Division (HSGD), for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 to fund the following State Homeland Security Grant Projects (SHSP):

- 1. Law Enforcement Regional Response Capabilities
- 2. Fire Services Regional Response Capabilities
- 3. Homeland Security Strategic Planning (1 position)
- 4. Planning and Analysis (CI/KR) Team (1 position)

A copy of said application is on file with the San Antonio Office of Emergency Management. The City Manager or designee, or the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) or designee, are hereby authorized to accept said grant, if awarded under the same terms and conditions as applied for. The City Manager or designee, or the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) or designee, are further authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate said application and acceptance of the grant award. A letter addressed to HSGD authorizing the submission of an application for grant funds, the designation of a point of contact for the City of

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San Antonio, and the execution of all necessary documents is attached hereto as ATTACHMENT I.

SECTION 2. The City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of San Antonio to accept said grant. The City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the awarded SHSP funds, the City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the HSGD in full. The City Council designates the Emergency Management Coordinator, Office of Emergency Management (OEM), as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

SECTION 3. Upon approval of this ordinance, a new fund and internal order number will be created. A final budget will be provided upon the award of the grant funds, upon which the above sum will be appropriated from EMC.

A personnel complement of two (2) Senior Management Analyst positions is **SECTION 4.** approved.

SECTION 5. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by eight (8) or more affirmative votes of the City Council. If less than eight (8) affirmative votes are received, then this Ordinance shall be effective ten (10) days after passage.
