RESOLUTION

SUBMISSION AUTHORIZING THE OF Α **GRANT** APPLICATION TO AND **AUTHORIZING** THE ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS FROM THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR THE **NEIGHBORHOODS FOR SAFE** PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$79,992.00 BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2019 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2020 FOR THE SAN ANTONIO METROPOLITAN HEALTH DISTRICT'S STAND UP SA PROGRAM.

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WHEREAS, according to the U. S. Census Bureau, San Antonio's population in 2014 was 1,436,697 making it the 7th largest city in the United States; and

WHEREAS, during 2014, San Antonio was ranked 7th, out of the top 10 most populated cities in the United States in the number of homicide deaths, with 7.17 deaths per 100,000 population; and

WHEREAS, the total number of homicides listed on the San Antonio Police Department's website for San Antonio in 2014 was 103; and

WHEREAS, in 2014 there were 33 murders in Stand Up SA's target area, comprised of four neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the population of the four neighborhoods was 83,520; and

WHEREAS, this equates to one-third of all the murders in the City of San Antonio being committed within the boundaries of these four neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, these neighborhoods contain only six percent of the population of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, the goals of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's (Metro Health) Stand Up SA program includes establishing meaningful, collaborative, and sustainable partnerships within targeted neighborhoods and educating the public regarding methodology to reduce gun violence; and

WHEREAS, with funding from the Governor's Office, Metro Health will hire a temporary Full-time Senior Management Analyst and purchase a laptop computer/software for the Senior Management Analyst; and

WHEREAS, Metro Health requests City Council authorize the department's submission of a grant application to and authorize the acceptance of funds awarded, if awarded, from the Office of the Governor for the Safe Neighborhoods Program; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District or designee is authorized to submit a grant application to and accept funds from the Office of the Governor for the Safe Neighborhoods Program in an amount not to exceed \$79,992.00 beginning October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's Stand Up SA Program. A copy of said grant application which is incorporated herein for all purposes is on file with the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.

SECTION 2. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District or designee, is authorized to initiate, negotiate, and execute any and all necessary documents and grant contracts to effectuate the application and acceptance of the referenced grant, and to execute contract amendments pertaining to this contract, to include: a) carry-over funds, when ascertained and approved by the funding agency through a revised notice of award; b) line item budget revisions authorized by the funding agency; c) modifications to the performance measures authorized by the funding agency and listed in the contract so long as the terms of the amendment stay within the general parameters of the intent of the grant; d) no cost extensions; e) amendments which will provide supplemental grant funds to a grant by the funding agency in an amount up to 20% of the total amount initially awarded to the grant; f) reimbursement increases of administrative funds for each participant served; g) amendments funding one time equipment purchases or defined program services; and h) changes in regulations mandated by the funding agency.

SECTION 3. The City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of San Antonio that the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's Stand Up SA Program be operated for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. The City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full. The City Council designates the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

SECTION 4. Should funding be awarded, upon acceptance of this award, new funds and internal order numbers will be created, upon which the award amount will be appropriated from the Office of the Governor. The proposed budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**, is approved and adopted for entry in the City books. A formal final budget which will include SAP Internal Orders and SAP GL Accounts will be submitted by the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District upon award.

SECTION 5. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.
